Tell us a little about your project. What are the main objectives of the project, and who will benefit from it?

The dialysis facilities that service the indigent patients in the revenue district of Pathanamthitta who suffer from kidney disease are not adequate to meet the current and anticipated demand . Patients with kidney disease depend on regular weekly dialysis treatments provided by the Pushpagiri Medical College Hospital to treat and control their disease. The current number of dialysis stations at the hospital is less than what is required to meet the current demand. A quota or queuing system has to be utilized, resulting in delays in the receipt of services. Some patients are not able to receive services at all. The purpose of this project is to provide additional dialysis facilities to enable the hospital to provide this life sustaining medical service to more patients and thereby alleviate suffering. The primary beneficiaries of the project are the indigent patients with kidney disease, who could not survive without this regular medical treatment. Kidney dialysis cost a lot of money and poor patients cannot afford it. We plan to provide additional dialysis machines for these poor patients.

Project planning

Describe the community needs that your project will address.

As the population of the area increases the relative incidence of kidney disease can be expected to increase. Implementing this project will assure the availability of life sustaining medical services to a vulnerable sector of the community for the reasonable future. The added capacity will serve to avoid the delays and denials of service presently experienced by indigent patients.

How did your project team identify these needs?

Host Committee has surveyed current dialysis patients and reviewed the adequacy and number of dialysis machines currently available to provide services. Discussions with Hospital staff and review of demographic data and service statistics support the conclusion that increasing the number of treatment stations as proposed will significantly improve the delivery and receipt of this necessary medical service.

How were members of the benefiting community involved in finding solutions?

Receivers of services participated in the survey, which addressed such issues as the frequency of dialysis services required, the availability of such services and their cost to the patient, and any issues in receipt of services (delays, extra trips required, service denied, etc.)

How were community members involved in planning the project?

In consultation with doctors and clinicians at the hospital, the members assessed the demand and current supply. With hospital medical staff they evaluated various options and concluded that four additional stations would be an appropriate number of stations to acquire based on the survey and analysis.

Upon cancellation, TRF shall be entitled to a refund of any global grant funds, including any interest earned, that have not been expended.
