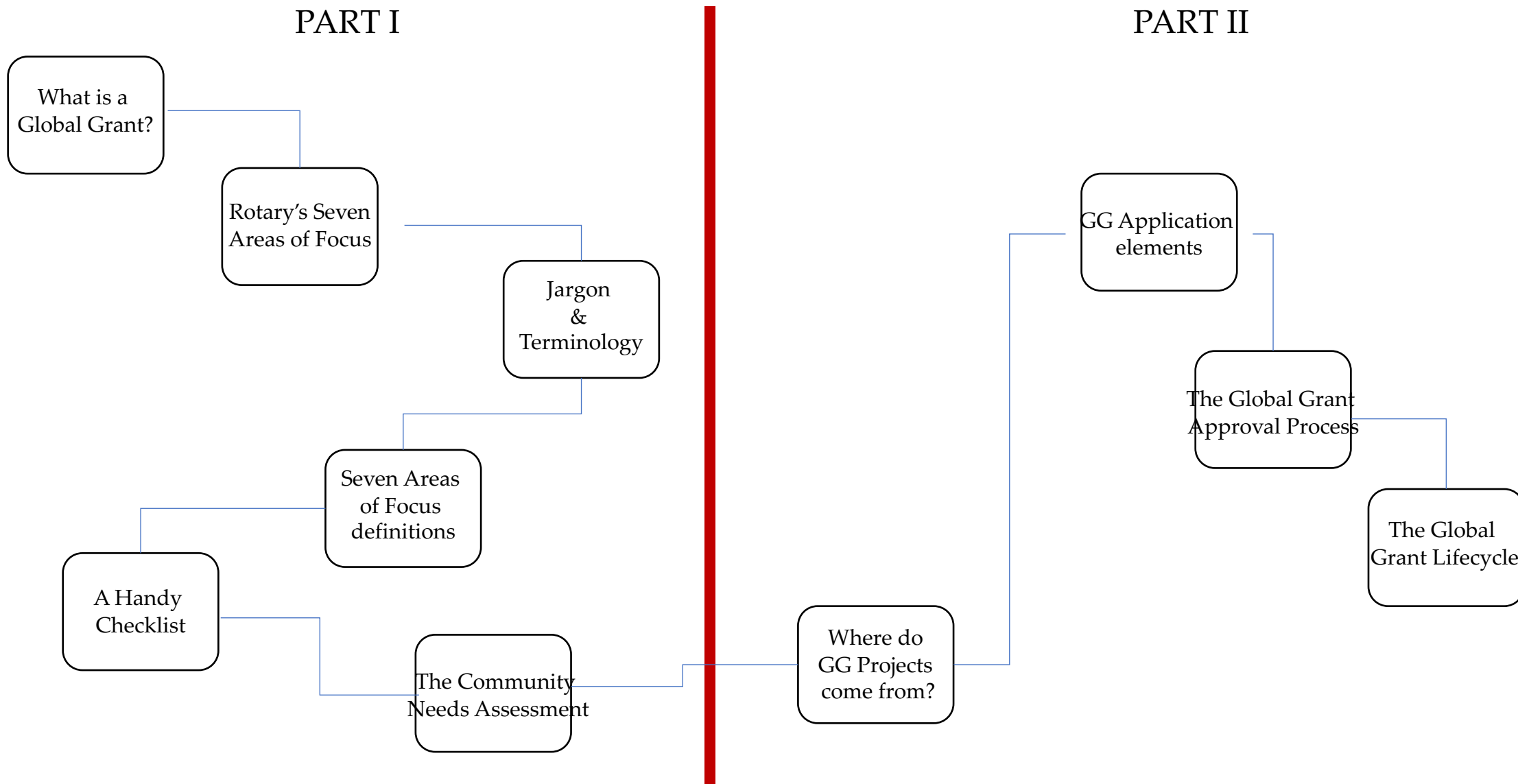

FOR WHAT?

For a project that involves clubs from two or more countries uniting to serve humanitarian needs one of their communities



HOW MUCH?

\$30,000 – \$400,000
the higher the better

World Community Service (WCS) is the Rotary program by which a club or district provides assistance to a club in another country via a **Global Grant**.

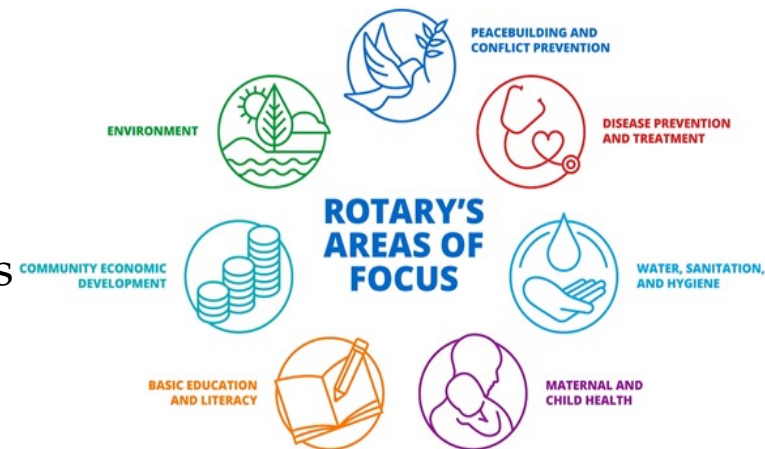


The ultimate object of WCS is to build goodwill and understanding among the peoples of the world.



Five Musts

1. Must fit into one of Rotary's Seven Areas of Focus



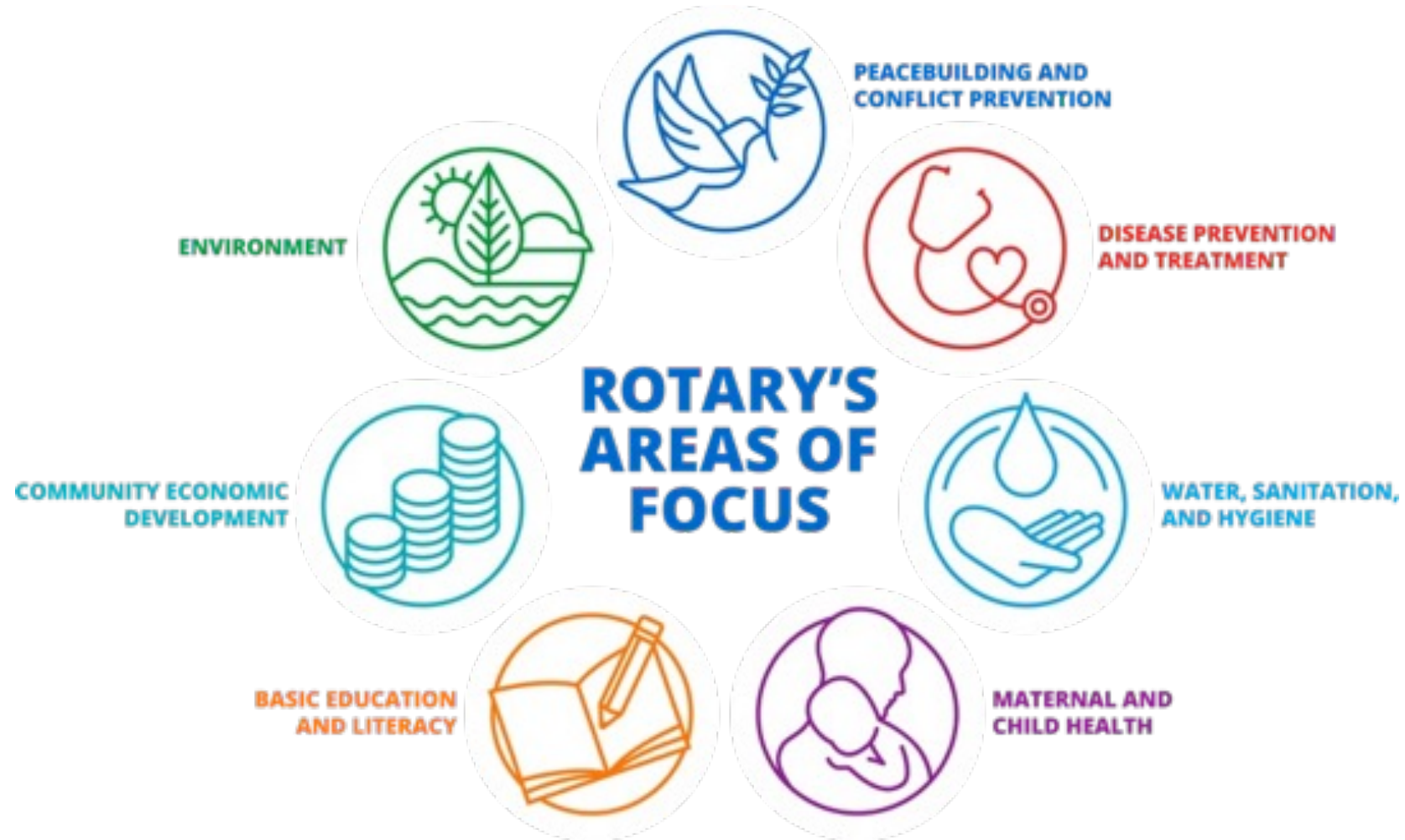
2. Must have a well-researched, well-defined Community Needs Assessment

3. Must have community (beneficiaries) buy-in



4. Must have a Host Club in the area where the project will be executed

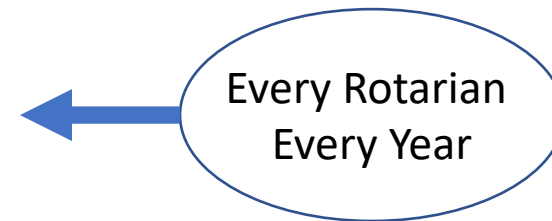
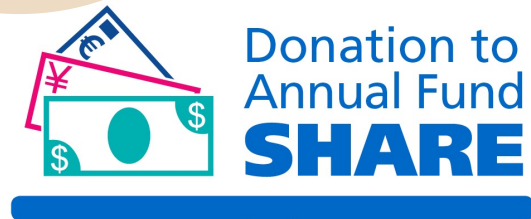
5. Must be Sustainable (what happens when Rotary leaves?)

PROJECT VALUE: The total project *Budget* in US\$

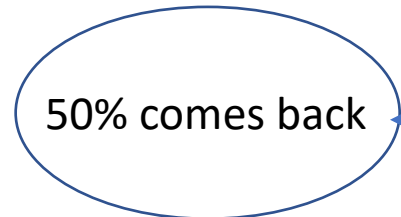

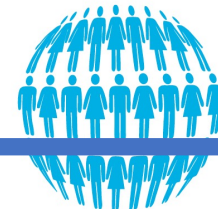

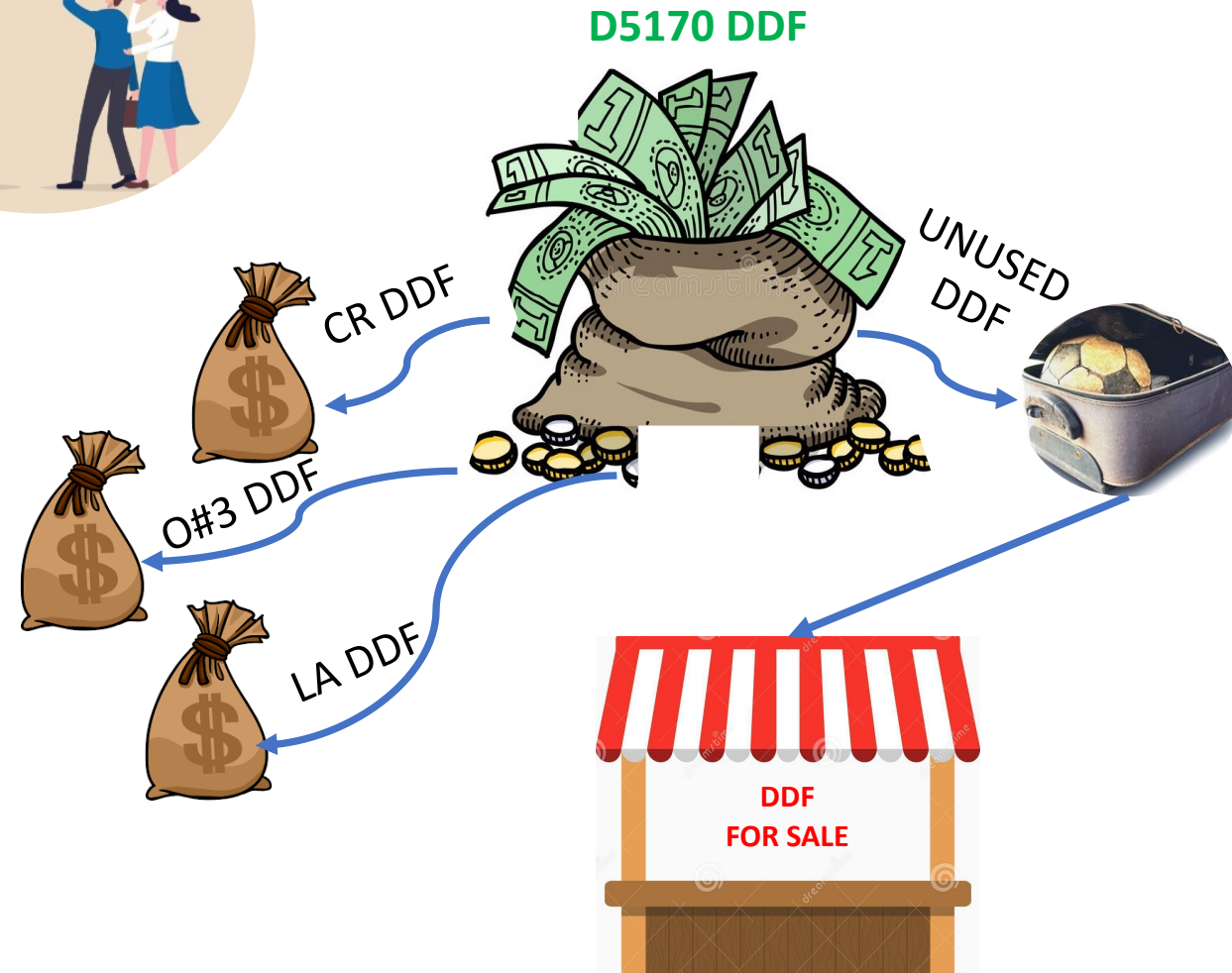

COMMUNITY ECONOMIC
DEVELOPMENT

Investments in people and communities to alleviate poverty.



DISEASE PREVENTION
AND TREATMENT

improving access to and expanding medical services, providing medical equipment, or training health care personnel.



ENVIRONMENT

Activities that strengthen the conservation and protection of natural resources, & advance environmental sustainability



WATER, SANITATION,
AND HYGIENE

management and protection of freshwater resources, universal and equitable access to safe drinking water, sanitation, and hygiene



MATERNAL AND
CHILD HEALTH

Activities and training to improve maternal health and reduce mortality for children under five.



BASIC EDUCATION
AND LITERACY

Activities and training to improve education for all children, and literacy for children and adults.

Has a Community Needs Assessment been done? (<u>On the ground with or by the Host Club</u>)			
Has a Host partner club been identified and qualified? (<u>Check with that District's Grants Coordinator</u>)			
Are the beneficiaries engaged & willing to take ownership?			
Has the Community Needs Assessment Results been published on TRF's form?			
Has Sustainability been adequately addressed?			
Has a preliminary proposal request for WCS consideration been completed? (CR form)			
What is the Fund-raising plan?
