




NEEDS, PRIORITIES, STRENGTHS, GAPS

Across India, **67%** of children of age 6-59 months had some degree of anemia In district Sirohi, the corresponding figure was 75.8%

Across India, **57%** of women of age 15-49 were found to be anemic In district Sirohi, the corresponding figure was 64%.

One of the biggest strengths of the community is that they realize the importance of this facility and truly utilize it to the best possible manner.





Kaikol & Nakudet Turkana County

Largest but Poorest county in Kenya Semi-arid area with no easy access to potable water

The impact of water on all aspects of development is undeniable and can help change the lives of millions. UNESCO Kenya Groundwater Mapping Program ----2013

Of Kenya's 41 million inhabitants, 17 million lack access to safe water and 28 million do not have adequate sanitation.





The Need

- Lack of clean water impacts sanitation & hygiene
- Village folk walk 8-10 Kms to get a 2-3 day water supply
- Forces a semi-nomadic subsistence
- All-day, Family endeavor
- Children are taken out of school often
- Sometimes they go to a dry riverbed and dig shallow holes for water





THE GRANT APPROVAL PROCESS










Global Grant Lifecycle
