Please review the volunteer schedule and let me know ASAP if you have any changes or conflicts. Try to find a sub if you can no longer participate. Call or email Bunny Pratt, 979.571.9826 or bunny@bcins.net with questions.

For Saturday Flag Setup/Sunday Breakdown volunteers—plan to wear your organization's shirt and comfortable shoes. You may want to dress in layers, bring work gloves, a hat, and sunscreen. Bottled water will be provided. Check-in and Check-out at the Volunteer Station Tent.

For Field Trip Volunteers - If you have a white FOV shirt from the past, please wear that with jeans or khakis and comfortable shoes (or your organization's t-shirt will work). I will have extra FOV t-shirts available for non-student volunteers. You may want to dress in layers since we will be outside. Plan to arrive on time based on your shift start (i.e. 8:30 for the 8:30-10:30 shift and 10:30 for the 10:30-12:30 shift). Park in the lot closest to the soccer fields (near the Harvey Rd. Entrance). DO NOT Park in the softball lot. This is where the school busses load \& unload the students. Check-in and Check-out at the Volunteer Station (pavilion structure). Bottled water will be available.

Script Readers, please print a copy of your assigned Tour Station Script (full booklet available for download online www.bryan-rotary.org and practice speaking the script aloud. Script Readers will remain stationary (bring a chair if needed). There are 10 Tour Stations total. Some are activity stations and some are listening stations. Schools will be divided in advance into Letter Groups A-J. If we do not get enough guides, the Docents will need to clearly direct their group which path to take to the next station.

Guides will be assigned a Letter and that determines the starting station. Guides will help meet the busses, gather your Letter Group of kids, and escort them to the starting station once cued. All schools have been asked to have 1 adult teacher/chaperone per group of 20 kids. As soon as all groups are situated, there will be an airhorn start and each group will move clockwise through the Tour Stations. There will be a Time Keeper giving a starting and stopping signal (air horn). The students have 3 minutes at each station, then 2.20 minutes to walk to the next stop. Once the tour starts it should last 52 minutes total. Guides will help escort/direct students between Tour Stations. If we do not get enough guides, the Docents will need to clearly direct their group which path to take to the next station. Guides will have a Tour Map with their trajectory through the stations.

## Weather
