Tana Plescher, US Navy Veteran who served during Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) and Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF), is a single mother of two young adults. She grew up in Irving, Texas and at the tender age of 7, recognized that she was put on this earth to serve others. Her purpose later became her dream and her dream eventually turned into a career in medicine. For well over a decade, Tana dedicated her life to the well-being of others, while serving in the US Military.

Tana served in the Navy as a Hospital Corpsman. Being a Hospital Corpsman afforded her many training opportunities in a multitude of areas. These included Combat ICU, Family Practice, OBGYN (assisting in the delivery of hundreds of babies), and eventually being named the Lead Petty Officer of a major clinic. She is proud of the fact that she was the most junior rank to ever lead such a high, profile clinic of this capacity.

Tana also provided emergency lifesaving care to those severely injured in combat during Operation Iraqi Freedom, ultimately playing a small role in bringing America's heroes' home.

Today, Tana continues to serve the veteran community as the Program Director for Grace After Fire, a nonprofit organization that provides much needed wellness programs and peer-to-peer services to women Veterans and their families after wearing the uniform.
