

Haywood Harris introduced our speaker, Tim Powers, Director of the Aggie Honor System Office for Texas A & M. He is also Haywood's son-inlaw, and Tim surely made Haywood proud as he did the rest of the club with his splendid

presentation.

Tim is responsible for Academic Integrity issues and training for all 50,000 students and 2400 faculty members of the University—some kind of a daunting task, I would think, even though the great tradition of A&M must ease off the difficulty somewhat.

Tim stressed the problems–particularly cheating–endemic in schools today, at all levels–from public schools to prestigious universities. Though not always perceived as a question of honor, Tim's premise is that such activities are one manifestation of the question.

He stressed the Aggie code: An Aggie will not lie, cheat, or steal, nor tolerate those who do. Tough to live by, but as he pointed out, closely parallel to **Rotary's Four Way Test**.

Tim told us afterwards that he brings that same program to high-school seniors across the state. Great show, indeed.

In Japan, we place great importance on the value of work. Whatever we are called to do, we should do it to the very best of our abilities, with dignity and with pride. Whether the job is running a country or shining shoes, there is honor in every vocation.

I gréw up embracing this belief, but I had never stopped to contemplate it. One day, in my third year in Rotary, we had a speaker at our club who talked about the purpose of one's livelihood. He asked, why do we work hard? What is the importance of our work?

I had never thought about this before. I never saw it as a question. We work to earn money. We work to be successful. We work because it is required of us. To me, this was all.

On that day, I learned about the idea of vocational service. It was the idea that through our work, we can serve others. We think about others' needs, and grow to care more for the needs of our communities. We build positive connections between people, and a more peaceful world.

This is the idea that has changed my life. It did not change how much I worked, or how hard I worked. But it changed why I worked, and how I experienced my life. It has made me see a higher number in everything I do.
