MRS. FISH WINS HONOR FOR HER ART EXHIBIT IN WASHINGTON

Mrs. Margaret Fish, Palestine artist, has won in the first group of pictures to be exhibited in Washington. It is a very distinct honor and will be read with pleasure by Mrs. Fish's many friends here and elsewhere.

The four first group prizes in connection with the forthcoming thirty-ninth annual exhibition of the Society of Washington Artists, which will open Sunday at Corcoran Gallery of Art were announced by the jury on award early this afternoon. Each prize consists of the society's bronze medal. Mrs. Fish's medal was for her landscape painting, *Old Church on a Hill*.

The jury on award consisted of Hans Schuler, sculptor, director of the Maryland Institute, Baltimore; Marion Hawthorne of New York, painter; and Vernall Abbott, artist and critic of Philadelphia. The exhibit will remain on view through January 31.

Note: Mrs. Fish was the mother of Eugene R. Fish, our club president 1923-24.

BRYAN EMPLOYER SPEAKS AT ROTARY

Claude Edge, Bryan Rotarian, told how taking employees of his firm, Lilly Ice Cream company, in as partners in the business has worked out well in an address to the Palestine Rotary Club today.

Edge said there is nothing revolutionary about the plan and nothing that other firms haven't done as well or better. But whatever success the company has is due to these relations with employees, he indicated.

Now 29 years old, the firm was established in Commerce in 1923, later operated in Navasota, and consolidated at Bryan in 1933. It serves an area from Mexia to Victoria, Taylor to Livingston, operating 15 trucks and employing from 60 to 80 workers.

"I can't remember when we've lost a key employee," he said. Facing always keen competition, the firm finds that its employees are a great help in meeting this competition. Probably the key to whatever success it has had lies in incentive pay

and employee benefits, Edge said.

When war veteran employees came back in 1946, the firm decided to let them share in its common stock. They now own one-fifth of the common stock, and can buy more as they choose. There is no limit or fixed schedule for stock purchase.

In 1947 the firm put in a sickness and accident coverage for employees, sharing the cost with them 50-50. In 1950 the company absorbed the total cost with the employees receiving all or the benefits of the coverage.

In 1948 the firm started concentrating on a new type of ice cream and went all out on this in 1949. Five cents from each gallon sold is set aside for an employee bonus, which amounted to one month's pay the first year and has increased to a peak of three months' pay for employees.

Sickness leave is up to two weeks plus 12 days is provided for long-term employees. "We can't believe this had paid off for us."

The employee who can't live on his salary is a problem solved by establishing an employees' loan association, now entirely operated by the employees. It loans money at 4 per cent interest or a minimum of \$1 interest. It has assets in excess of \$12,000, with less than \$500 cash on hand.

A profit sharing pension trust fund was established last year. One-third goes into an insurance policy and two-thirds is invested for the employee for whom at the end of 10 years a 10 year or 20 year annuity is bought which he can draw when he reaches retirement age or which his survivors can draw.

Employees are encourage to make suggestions for improving the business and this has proved beneficial. Regular employee meetings are held as well as departmental meetings.
