Community Relations Chair Vera McKissic provided us with a Membership Minute during which she encouraged Rotarians to invite others to join the club so that it reflects the diversity of the community from which it grew. Assistant Club Service (Membership) Chair Randy Hendricks introduced his guest, Heidi Hardy, who has begun the process of becoming a Rotarian. We hope to see Heidi wearing a red badge soon.

Rotary International Foundation Chair Sally Hopper announced that Club Secretary Mia Russo was celebrating a birthday. (Which birthday is presently undisclosed.) Sally also announced that four club members were celebrating the anniversaries of their becoming Rotarians: Fred Weekley (5 years); Norman Douglas (38 years); Hal Thurow (38 years); and Hugh Ross (a whopping sixty years). Hugh assured us that he was a Junior Rotarian when he joined the club. This would explain the Dorian Gray-like distinction between Hugh's years of service and his youthful appearance.

Kurt Bartley introduced our program, Dawud Mabon, who spoke on the Law of Intentionality. Dawud is a speaker, trainer and coach with the Mabon Leadership Group and is a certified member of the John Maxwell Team. He is also a Certified Public Accountant and Director of Youth Service at the Arlington Highlands Rotary Club. Dawud authored a book: God Loves a Cheerful Giver. He trains teams in leadership, personal growth and in reaching goals.

Dawud observed that writing one's thoughts is a valuable exercise because thoughts disentangle through the pencil tip. He also observed that the most dangerous thought in the collection is "I've heard that before," often because it causes the thinker to disregard the message. He went on to share with the club the "Law of Intentionality": growth doesn't just happen. We have to be intentional about it; the sooner we make the transition to becoming intentional about our

growth the better it is because growth compounds and accelerates as we remain intentional about it. He also recommended John Maxwell's book, *Fifteen Invaluable Lesson of Growth*.

Dawud, a motivational speaker, implored us to be fully present in our lives, observed that life is in session and indicated that we must be intentional about our growth. Among much else he described the five traps we must take care not to fall into: the assumption gap (assuming that we should live our lives as directed by others rather than plotting our own courses); the knowledge gap (I don't know how to grow so I won't worry about it); the timing gap (I'm too busy now but surely there will be a better time to do this); the mistake gap (inaction due to a fear that we might make a misstep); and the perfection gap (not seeking a better course due to a worry that you can never find the perfect way).

Dawud concluded with a powerful thought: don't complain about your circumstances. Pay the price for becoming what you want to be. He then answered questions from the group. President Susie announced that the club would donate a book, "The Book Rescuer," to the Webb Elementary School Library to honor our speaker.

Dan Blumberg presented "The Last Laugh". It was announced that the club's speaker at its February 11, 2021 meeting will be Al Jones, Arlington's new Chief of Police. Following our collective recitation of Rotary's Four-Way Test, we were adjourned.
