

The only real qualification is a background check and a desire to have a teenage student in your home. The wonderful opportunity will be to show the student our city, our state, and the United States and help to build world peace through understanding.

The second announcement made by Lynn (I always refer to myself in the third person) was the Read with Rotary spring event which will be held May 13th and 14th. This is a program where every student at Webb is allowed to attend a book fair, pick out a book and then 'claim it' as their very own, forever book. We, the Rotary Club of Arlington, buy a book for every child at Webb. #### WHAT IS A SHELTERBOX?

We deliver the essentials people need to begin rebuilding their lives in the aftermath of a disaster. When we send boxes, each one is tailored to a disaster but typically contains a disaster relief tent for a family, thermal blankets and groundsheets, water storage and purification equipment, solar lamps, cooking utensils, a basic tool kit, mosquito nets, and a children's activity pack.

Sometimes our aid is not packed in boxes but sent in bulk. It is essential that we always support the needs of those who have survived disasters and this can vary enormously based on the type and scale of a disaster. We also do this to maximize donors' money, ensuring that we only send what is really needed and appropriate for the situation and culture.
