

Arlington native Letatia Teykl was named executive director of Levitt Pavilion Arlington by the organization's board of directors. She began her new position with the concert pavilion on Nov. 18th, 2019. Letatia is a Sam Houston High School graduate and a graduate of Texas Wesleyan University, where she earned a bachelor's degree in business administration. She has more than 25 years of experience in community engagement, marketing, and leadership.

Letatia shared how the Levitt in Arlington was the only Levitt across the country to put concerts on the lawn in 2020. The Levitt holds special events in addition to concerts. During the 2021 year, they were trying to figure out if they would be able to have concerts. Things began to come together in March. Sure enough, they were able to get people on the lawn enjoying live music. The Levitt is committed to reaching all people from all four corners of Arlington. In 2021 the Levitt paid out \$494,000 in artist contracts.

The Levitt mission is to provide free, culturally diverse music that can be enjoyed by everyone while building community through music. They achieve this through their music, programs, partnerships, and outreach.

Levitt Arlington's commitment to diversity and inclusion is firmly rooted in their culture and their role as stewards of Levitt Arlington. Every Decision they make to best serve their musicians, staff, volunteers, community, board, and partners is guided by one simple statement: "Music Connects Us"

As stewards of Levitt Arlington, they believe they must:

Love music and believe in its ability to stir emotions that bring people together regardless of background, experiences, or differences. Serve others by raising their collective voices to support the arts and provide equal opportunities for all


