As Don showed the pictures of the devastation and the plan Rotarians had to bring in mobile hospitals to help, we were reminded that all together we are people of action throughout the world. Our club earlier this year joined with another in our district to provide mobile hospitals for war torn Ukraine. This global reach is why Rotarians are always confident that at any given moment we are impacting the world around us.

In this peacebuilding and conflict prevention month, we are called to not only help the obvious conflicts and devastation that I articulated above, but to be ambassadors of change within our own country to build a sense of belonging and a venue for building upon what unites us. URGENT NEED IN TURKEY

As of this writing, over 46,000 people have been killed in the tragic earthquake in Turkey/Syria and there is a very large number of injuries. To address the survivors, the Caddebostan Rotary Club (near Istanbul) is putting together a Rotary Grant to build and deploy a portable hospital. It will have an Emergency room, a Patient Observation room with four beds, a laboratory, clean and used water tanks, an electric generator, water closet and showers, and a storage area for a total completed cost of US \$ 300,000.00. The continuation of the staff and consumables will be ensured by the Health Department. The Turkey Rotary club will be the primary sponser and the Houston District and one of the clubs will be one of the International partners. The Global Grant request for Rotary Foundation funding will be sent to the Rotary Disaster Fund for faster service.

Help is needed to fund this project. If you can issue a check to "Gulfway Hobby Airport Rotary club Charitable Foundation, Inc." and put your Rotary number (found on the mailing label of "Rotary" magazine) and Turkey Earthquake Relief, and give it to me at Rotary, I will send it to them This is a tax deductible charitable foundation contribution and it will give you points towards your next Paul Harris Fellow. But the main thing is that the number of injuries is significant and a portable hospital will be most useful in their time of dire need.

Our Club's Board met on Friday, February 17, 2023, and here are the primary items we discussed and actions that were taken:

Planning for the Centennial Celebration event is progressing nicely. The sponsorship committee has raised in excess of \$35,000 and is working to obtain items for the raffle which will be held at the Centennial Dinner. Anyone with raffle items should see Grace Whetstone who is spearheading the high/low raffle event. The event ticket and sponsorship registration for Arlington Rotarians will be launched early next week and the board was encouraged to be sure they reach out to any past Rotarians or spouses of deceased Rotarians to ensure everyone is invited. Rotarians from our club and Arlington will be given first pass at registering before any announcement will go out the full 5790 district and leadership.

The Membership Chairs as directed by the Board at the last meeting brought forth, and the board adopted, a procedure for evaluating applicants for membership who are not sponsored by a member. Non-sponsored applicants will be interviewed by a past president and additional board member to ensure that each non-sponsored applicant meets the membership standards to which sponsored applicants are held. Our Club Membership chairs will create an interview script for the interviews to ensure that all applicants are treated fairly. The Board will review the script at the next meeting. All adopted updates will be reflected on the membership portion of our website.

The Board was reminded to continue promoting the Minority Business Recognition program. The recognition of the first recipient will now be Thursday, 23, 2023. The weekly meeting was called to order at 12:10 pm by President Victoria Farrar-Myers. Willie Rodriguez offered the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance. Rotary clubs are working together in order to raise

\$300.000.00 in order to construct a Multi Clinic in Turkey. The clinic will have a patient ward, water, a laboratory, and generators, among other things. Donations may be made by going to rotary.org. The website has a link to Turkey/Syria Disaster Response Fund where donations can be made. Grace Whetstone is seeking donations to be part of the Centennial Celebration raffle. If you have items to donate, please contact Grace. She also indicated that she is the Director of the Arlington Miracle Baseball League and is seeking volunteer coaches. The season is set to begin on March 25. Barry Bondurant announced the program for today. The program was presented by Eric White, the AISD's Athletic Director. Mr. White has been the athletic director for five years. Prior to coming to the AISD, Mr. White was the Assistant Athletic Director of Mansfield ISD for twelve years. His prior experience was at Fort Worth ISD and Joshua ISD. Eric is a graduate of Baylor University, is married and has two daughters.

Mr. White informed the club that the Arlington ISD has six high schools and ten junior high schools. One of his functions as the athletic director is to empower, support the coaches and to create opportunities for them. He indicated that athletics serves as a tool for life. The goal of coaches is to teach children how to become successful adults. A coach should focus on character, discipline, integrity and work ethic. As a coach, wins will come. However, a coach should "Take your eyes off the scoreboard and put them on the kids". A coach needs to teach kids to compete as life is a competition. The goal of a coach should be to impact students' lives.

Mr. White listed some of the accomplishments of the AISD athletics for 2022-2023. Volleyball has three teams in the playoffs: one high school won the district championship in cross country; three teams made the playoffs in football; three high schools advanced to playoffs in basketball; in swimming and diving fifty students advanced to regionals; in wrestling twenty-three students advanced to the state tournament; and in cheerleading, Lamar High School finished in the top twenty in Texas 6A programs.

Victoria presented a book to the Webb Library to honor Eric White. The title of the book is "The Peace Book".

Dan Blumberg presented a Rotary historical moment.

Victoria informed us that next program will be on February 23, 2023, at J. Gilligans. The program will be the new UTA athletic director, Jon Fagg.
