By carrying out service projects and supporting peace fellowships and scholarships, our members take action to address the underlying causes of conflict, including poverty, discrimination, ethnic tension, lack of access to education, and unequal distribution of resources.

Our commitment to peacebuilding today answers new challenges: how we can make the greatest possible impact and how we can achieve our vision of lasting change. We are approaching the concept of peace with greater cohesion and inclusivity, broadening the scope of what we mean by peacebuilding, and finding more ways for people to get involved.

We are blessed with what God has provided, but also aware that the need is far greater than our resources currently provide.

Thanks to our donors, in December 2017, we moved from our cramped offices to a newly

Future additions will include specialized treatment rooms, patient health and employee training classrooms, a job skills computer room, a childcare area available to those in patient classes and much more. We are also exploring agreements with nonprofit social service providers to expand on-site services to the economically disadvantaged.
