To honor the memory of their father, the younger Lohs launched a foundation that awards scholarships to students and provides aid to community nonprofits. Its name? The LOH Foundation: Love, Opportunity, Hope, "continuing the legacy of spreading Love, providing Opportunity, and giving Hope to all."

Asia Times Square has grown from what was once a market that served the community and provided for a family with big dreams, to a multi-purpose center with restaurants, boutiques, grocers, beauty and health providers, and other retailers that hosts the popular "Dem Cho Hoa" (Night Flower Market) to celebrate each Lunar New Year.

Matthew Loh cares deeply for his community and likes bringing different cultures together to learn about one another to create a connection.
