Barry Bondurant introduced our speaker, Juanita Hargrove, Administrative Officer of the Dallas-Fort Worth National Cemetery. The beautiful park-like grounds are located at 2000 Mountain Creek Parkway in Dallas.

Some things we learned: the facility is open daily from sunrise to sunset. Office hours: Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Please contact the office for holiday closings.

The cemetery has space available to accommodate both casketed and cremated remains. Burial in this and other national cemeteries is open to all members of the armed forces who have met a minimum active duty service requirement and were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable. A veteran's spouse, widow or widower, minor dependent children and, under certain conditions, unmarried adult children with disabilities may also be eligible for burial. Eligible spouses and children may be buried even if they predecease the veteran in death. Members of the reserve components of the armed forces who die while on active duty or who die while on training duty or who were eligible for retired pay may also be eligible for burial.

The Dallas-Fort Worth National Cemetery was dedicated and opened for burials on May 12, 2000. The cemetery is situated on a 638.5-acre parcel of land that overlooks picturesque Mountain Creek Lake. The gently rolling hills provide a pastoral *(Continued on page 4)*
