One important aspect of our club's community involvement is presenting Minority Business Recognition Awards. Eunice Currie introduced Elizabeth Kobty of Prince Lebanese Grill as the latest recipient of this honor. Elizabeth spoke briefly about her family's business and thanked us for the honor.

Next up was Randy Hendricks who brought forth another exceptional addition to our club. Shannon Porter is the current Executive Director of River Legacy Park. After multiple jobs at River Legacy, she took over as Executive Director about 1 ½ years ago. Victoria presented Shannon with her Red Badge. Dick Moise is her sponsor and Linda Gibson is her mentor.

Victoria then invited Rigien Jackson to come back up to the podium and lead us in singing the "Star Spangled Banner," feeling that it was only fitting and very special for her to do so because she has just received her United States citizenship. This prompted a rousing round of applause and a standing ovation, not just our usual smattering of stuttering claps.

Victoria called upon Clete to introduce the speakers for today's program, Pastors Chris and Molly Hayes of First United Methodist Church in Arlington, our Rotary Club of Arlington meeting place for the past 99 years. Their talk was entitled "Clean Water Projects in Cuba". Chris gave an overview of their mission to bring clean water to underdeveloped nations like Haiti and Cuba. Molly then began her presentation by asking two questions: *What have you used water for in the last 24 hours?* and *Why is clean water important?* They presented some startling statistics including: 1 in 10 people have no clean water; one in three people have no proper sanitation facilities; every two minutes a child dies

from a water-borne illness; 2.5 times the U.S. population (785 million people) do not have access to clean water; and 266 million hours per day (30,000 years per day) are spent collecting water.

Chris and Molly are associated with "Water to Life," a group which aims to transform lives and communities starting with clean water. They started over ten years ago in Haiti with the introduction of 'bucket filters' which cost around \$40 to get a family situated with clean water for ten years. After the recent turmoil in Haiti it became difficult to provide humanitarian assistance there so they turned their attention to rural areas of Cuba. They attribute the success of the program to the ease of getting the filters to the countries in need as well as the low cost of the supplies. But the most important aspect of the program is building relationships in the communities they serve so that the project is sustainable. No better example of this is the relationship they forged with a cardiac surgeon in Cuba who noted that patients had successful surgeries but ended up with dysentery upon leaving the hospital because it had no clean water. The solution was a relatively low cost (\$2500-3000) facility filter which can process 500 gallons of water hourly. Their goal is to outfit as many rural hospitals as they are able to with this system and then to make sure that the local residents have a bucket filter and instructions on how it works. Afterward, they took several questions from the group. Victoria presented them with a book to sign for the Webb Elementary School library.

Kris Landrith made us chuckle with his 'Hysterical/ Hystorical Minute'. Victoria reminded us that next week's meeting will be at Cornerstone Baptist Church and will include a program on Arlington Municipal Airport Operations by Trent Ballard. She then thanked Dan, Rigien, Kathleen and our newest member, Shannon, as well as our four visitors.

The membership then joined in reciting the Four Way Test and Victoria sent us out reminding us that "We are people of Impact, go make a difference this week." The meeting was then adjourned.
