University of Texas at Arlington's Women's and Gender Studies program in the College of Liberal Arts. Her purpose is to allow UTA, its students and faculty as well as the people of North Texas to gain a better understanding of the women in Afghanistan and the situation they face.

Roshan opened the floor with condolences for the shooting victims in Uvalde, Texas. She mentioned that the tragedy was relatable and not foreign to their lifestyle in Afghanistan. She resonated with the heartache that she recognizes the community is enduring following the shooting. Roshan fled Afghanistan with her husband and their five children during the Fall of Kabul and the Taliban takeover in 2021. Roshan says "that is a day she cannot forget". Roshan and her family members lost everything, including their homes and their personal belongings, but were able to save their lives. Long before fleeing, Roshan knew the treatment of women in Afghanistan was unfair and started as an activist in 1986. Early on Roshan began educating other women within Afghanistan, as that had been taken away from them. Roshan is quoted as saying "Education is a very fundamental right". She took a bold stance and not only taught Afghan women but she also hid them in her home as well. To make a bolder statement, Roshan became a member of several organizations to assist in advocacy and has spent her career advocating on behalf of the women of Afghanistan within organizations such as the Afghan Women's Network. Roshan continues to fight for that here and in her country. She told an extraordinary story.

In honor of today's program President Kurt presented a book to Roshan Mashal that will be given to the Webb Elementary School library in her honor.

Kris Landrith gave The Last Laugh.

President Kurt recited this week's quote and then led Rotarians in the Four-Way Test. We were then adjourned.
