As I sit here on the morning of our 100th Anniversary, I cannot help but reflect on all the Rotarians who came together to make the realization of our 100th year Project and evening Celebration a success. As I looked out at all of our members, I could not help but feel awed at the amazing family I had chosen to join. Nor could I help but see a glimpse of our second century in the palpable energy of our Club and in the eyes of the next generation ready to carry on the torch.

I was asked to share as my column this week the remarks I made at the unveiling of our commissioned art piece "Boundless" and the unveiling of the plans for the Rotary Dream Park. So here you go ...

Good morning. My name is Victoria Farrar-Myers and I am the President of the Rotary Club of Arlington. Rotary is a worldwide organization formed by individuals committed to service above self, and leaving their communities and the world better than they found it. The Rotary Club of Arlington was formed on June 11, 1923, and is often referred to as the "downtown" club. On behalf of our club and all Rotarians in Arlington, it is my honor to dedicate this commissioned, public art

This moment has been long in coming. We appointed a committee five years ago to determine what would be a fitting gift to the city to commemorate our Club's centennial this year. After all, our club has long contributed to the fabric of this community. The founders of our club and members over the years names appear on street signs, parks, and buildings, and are among the leaders who have helped Arlington become the city we all love. Our club donated the land for the first park in Arlington, Meadowbrook Park, and helped foster the City's park system through subsequent donations.

It is no surprise then we wanted to find a way to honor this storied past, but also leave an everlasting gift for residents and visitors alike to identify with our city. After consulting key community stakeholders and the City, we embarked upon the acquisition of a public art piece fitting of its place at the gateway of downtown and forever located in what will now be known as the Rotary Dream Park.

While the vertical element of the sculpture, whose pieces light up and swirl when visitors interact with it, represents an homage to the iconic Rotary emblem, the sculpture itself was created to inspire all to imagine the boundless possibilities available here in The American Dream City and in the world.

Barry Bondurant introduced Gloria Pena, President of the Arlington Rotary Foundation, who gave a very thorough presentation of the financial state of our foundation and our Webb Elementary School project. This Rotary year the Arlington Rotary Foundation has provided \$69,000 in scholarships to 66 high school graduates who attended Webb. We also provided a \$2,000 scholarship to each of two Arlington High School seniors. We donated 564 Book Fair books to the Webb School; \$2,666 of the necessary funding came from our dedicated Lisann Peters Read With Rotary fund, which is invested together with our other foundation funds. The foundation spent \$2,940 to send Webb fifth and sixth graders to Camp Carter. And the foundation provided fifty medals to Webb attendees at five Arlington High Schools. Finally, we presented 71 medals to Webb Elementary School sixth graders.

Barry Bondurant also introduced our speaker, Trent Ballard, City of Arlington Airport Manager. He was previously a Board Member at the Texas Airports Council. Some highlights of his very informative presentation were the facts that the Arlington Airport relieves the Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport and Love Field of overcrowding flight training and corporate air traffic. Also, Bell Helicopter conducts flight testing at the Arlington Airport. The economic impact of the airport is impressive: 22 businesses and 240 aircraft are based there. The airport employs about 900 employees. The salaries, wages and benefits total \$520 million. Economic activity arising from the airport totals \$236 million. Mr. Ballard pointed out that air traffic increases drastically during periods in which the Dallas Cowboys are playing at home, particularly during Super Bowl events. The main segments of business based at the airport are aircraft sales, research/flight training, flight instruction, aircraft repair, aircraft storage and itinerant aircraft services. Van Bortel Aircraft, the

world's largest Cessna dealer, is based there. It sold over 300 planes valued at \$149,000 each during 2019 for a total of \$2.1 million in sales. The Arlington Airport also houses the designated Cessna prop-jet service center. Another business based there is Harrison Aviation. The airport is also involved in outreach to the community, hosting airport field trips for youth, discovery days, the North Texas Council of Governments aviation education initiative and historic aircraft tours.
