Treasurer's Report



Rotarians,

Our board of directors has been working hard on a budget for our centennial year that is both a responsible use of our resources and allows us to meet our community and international service goals. We began our year with an operating cash balance of \$47,841, which is higher than it has been in years past due to cost savings we experienced during the pandemic. Although the board is mindful of moving forward with a large reserve, we recognize that we may have some larger expenditures in the future and, at this time, we do not have a plan to increase our membership dues. We also have a balance in our Edward Jones account of \$25,598 which has been designated for our centennial celebration gift to the City of Arlington. For this year, we are projecting to have revenues totaling \$125,785 and expenditures of \$139,366. You can easily tell this results in a deficit of \$13,581. It is our club's long-standing tradition to send our incoming president to the Rotary International Convention regardless of location. From time to time, this results in us relying on our reserves, which is the case for the upcoming convention in Melbourne, Australia in 2023. I'm thankful for the work of the board of directors for their help in pulling a reasonable and meaningful budget together for our centennial year. What a blessing it is to be a part of such a vibrant club!

Mark Rawlings is the principal of Syndicated Contracting Services and is responsible for spearheading the restoration for The Baker Hotel and Spa. Mark has found his niche specializing in remodeling for the hospitality industry, focusing on restaurants and bars, particularly those involving historic restorations. In 1998 Mark's focus turned to the hotel industry, project managing the restoration of the Historic Driskill Hotel in Austin. Mark has been instrumental in restorations throughout the State of Texas.

The Baker Hotel opened in 1929 in Mineral Wells, Texas. The hotel was built by T.B. Baker at a cost of \$1.2 million dollars. The hotel opened two weeks after the great stock market crash. The hotel had 460 rooms, two suites, two complete spas, an outdoor Olympic-sized pool and famous cloud room. The hotel served as a playground for

RECOGNIZING THE PAST TO INSPIRE THE FUTURE

SO HOW DID IT ALL BEGIN?

The Club Organization Meeting was held on May 29, 1923. Tom L. Cravens and Gordon Hill were responsible for the organization. Bert Tolbert of Fort Worth was a special representative for the organization.

The Charter was presented by District Governor John Singleton of Waxahachie on June 11, 1923. There were seventeen charter members: Elvis W. Altman, Dry Goods Retailing; Garner C. Ammon, Restaurants; A. Cliff Barnes, Hardware Retailing; Horace E. Cannon, Florist; Carl F. Chancellor, Telephone Service; William E. Clark, Newspaper-Magazine Agency; P. Leslie Coulter, Drug Retail; Tom L. Cravens, Real Estate; Frank P. Hall, Auto Accessories Retail; V. Gordon Hill, Newspaper Publishing; Edward C. McKnight, Groceries Retailing; C. Ray McKnight, Men's Furnishing Retail; Hugh M. Moore, Undertaking, Thomas Spruance, Trust and Savings Bank; Elmer L. Taylor, Furniture Retail; Myron L. Williams, Education-College; and Sam F. Wine, Electric Light and Power Service. Sam Wine was elected the first president.

The club's week luncheon meetings were held in Ammon's restaurant but this was unsatisfactory because the meeting place did not have a separate dining/meeting room. The meetings were moved to the First Christian Church and service was by the ladies of the church. Within a year (1924) the club moved to its current home, First United Methodist Church. The ladies of the church prepared the meals.

From these beginnings The Rotary Club of Arlington has continued to serve our community by sponsoring improvements as a group and through individual members.

celebrities, famous musicians and cattle barons. The fully air-conditioned hotel hosted Clark Gable, Judy Garland and Ronald Reagan. The Baker Hotel operated until it closed for good in 1972.

The hotel was purchased in 2019 by the development team. The hotel had been on the market for sale since it closed in 1972. It sat vacant for forty-seven years. The restoration began by utilizing 964 roll off dumpsters. All the plumbing had to be removed as well as the electrical wiring. The team intends to re-purpose as much of the original material as possible. This includes marble that is three inches thick, doors, chandeliers, light fixtures, a shoe- shine booth and a ticket booth.

The Baker Hotel and Spa will have 165 guest rooms, retail shops, restaurants, a private Brazos Club, a ballroom that will seat 700 guests, a spa, convention and business facilities and a coffee shop. The local mineral springs will be utilized again, along with modernized amenities made for the lifestyle of modern guests. The hotel expects to host weddings, special events, conventions and weekend travelers. To learn more about the renovation of The Baker Hotel, please visit thebakerhotelandspa.com.
