

in the Texas Legislature representing the people of Arlington, Dalworthington Gardens and Pantego in Tarrant County. Tinderholt serves on the Committee on Homeland Security & Public Safety as well as the Committee on Defense & Veterans' Affairs. He is the Chairman of the House Veterans Caucus and also serves as a Floor Leader for the House Republican Caucus.

Tinderholt has been named a "Taxpayer Champion" by Texans for Fiscal Responsibility, "Faith & Family Champion" by Texas Values and "Courageous Conservative" by Texas Conservative Coalition.

Many education, business, pro-life, transportation, public safety and gun rights groups have also recognized his leadership.

He is a proud father to his four children (Kayley, Nathan, Tyler and Brenan) and grandfather of two (Jaxon & Vanellope). He is happily married to his wife, Bethany, a loving mother, Executive Director of the Arlington Police Foundation and former Dallas Cowboys Cheerleader.

Before his state service, Tinderholt had a decorated military career. He entered active duty Air Force in 1988 as a Spanish Cryptologic Linguist, taking part in counter drug missions throughout South and Central America. Following 9/11, he reentered military service, this time in the Army. Tinderholt worked as a platoon leader, executive officer, detachment commander and recruiting commander and volunteered to deploy to multiple combat zones. At one point he oversaw an \$836 million budget and managed a team of over 400. In his 21 years in the armed forces, Major (Ret.) Tinderholt served tours across several continents, earning awards to include the Bronze Star Medal and Combat Action Badge.

In civilian life, Tinderholt previously served as a Spanish professor and holds a Master's Degree in Educational Leadership. He currently employs

dozens of Texans as a business owner in the Metroplex. Because his business involves school security Tinderholt votes "present" on all bills involving school security that come before the Texas Legislature.

The Tinderholt family is very active in the community. They have served alongside a variety of organizations including Spirit of Hope Arlington, Catholic Charities of Fort Worth, Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation, St. Jude Medical Center, and the Arlington Police Foundation.

Tinderholt is Lutheran and his family attends St. Vincent De Paul Catholic Church in Southwest Arlington.

Tinderholt indicated that top issues the Texas House of Representatives will address during the upcoming legislative session include school security, inflation and the economy as well as border issues. He also feels that water and energy are important items. Although he has solar panels on his home he would not want to rely primarily on solar and wind power but sees them as good back-up sources of power. Continuing to develop thermal energy such as coal and natural gas is important to Tinderholt as he believes it is most reliable and plentiful. He is also interested in desalination plants on the gulf to provide water for Texas and other growing states.

Another issue important to Tinderholt is taxes. He feels that a flat consumption tax would be most fair and dislikes property taxes. He gave a sad example of a retired teacher who lives on a fixed income and although her mortgage is paid off she can no longer afford the taxes on her home.

The club donated a book to Webb Elementary to honor Rep. Tinderholt and to thank him for his presentation. He signed the book.

At the end of the meeting, Tom Ware presented a hysterical minute.
