cases 648 removals, and tragically, 15 fatalities. A helpful chart explained the 5 main duties of a CASA volunteer: LEARN (all you can about the child and family life) ENGAGE (regular visits with the child in home, observe parent/child visits once per month, provide consistency) RECOMMEND (speak up for the child's best interests) COLLABORATE (with involved parties to ensure necessary services provided) REPORT (what you have learned/observed during hearings 4-6 times per year)

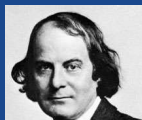
