#### **Chad on Catering**

Hello fellow Servant Leaders!

Our President, Kurt Bartley, asked me to form a committee to review our catering options in September. A big "Thank You" to Susie McAlister, Joy Bates, Tom Ware and Randy Hendricks for agreeing to join me on this committee. Last week we gave a preliminary report to our Board of Directors. Some of the issues that have been voiced as concerns are limited protein options, limited salad additions, and lack of food variety from week to week. We have a plan in place to continue with Simply Divune until the end of December. During the next month your committee will continue a review of other caterer options to begin implementation in January. It has become apparent that due to supply chain and inflation issues our lunch pricing has limited caterers ability to meet our needs as expressed by our Members and Board. That became clearly evident as we began interviewing available caterers. Statistically, food costs have gone up almost 16% in the last two years (and projected to continue to increase in the coming months) and labor is difficult to find in the food service industry. Our prior caterer had to remove himself from doing our catering due to lack of labor and higher food costs.

Taking the desires of our members into account coupled with the information our committee found in our preliminary interviews with prospective caterers, your Board unanimously approved a Motion to increase our lunch prices to \$ 15 effective in January. We also discussed some soup and salad and perhaps a stuffed baked potato and salad lunch

Sally Hopper, director of Rotary Foundation, was our featured speaker. She was introduced by Victoria Farrar-Myers who explained that Sally had actually convinced her to join Rotary! Sally explained the Rotary Foundation very thoroughly during her presentation. There are 3 branches of polio foundation: Polio Plus Fund, Endowment Fund and Annual Fund. \$10k is the smallest gift for the endowment (funds are professionally invested and only the earnings are spent), but the other branches take smaller donations. Birthday checks go into the annual fund. The Annual fund has helped send kids to camp and buy school uniforms, books etc. Our Pints for Polio (Oct. 16 event) earned \$2500, and of course this is doubled

by matching contributions of the Gates.

Sally then pointed out that our club has 80 members who are Paul Harris fellows! PHF contributors have donated \$1k. 9 of our members are major donors of \$10k. Of course, cash, life income agreements, bequests, real estate or securities may be left to this fund.

Last year, worldwide, \$123 million was contributed! The Rotary Club of Arlington has 100% participation every year!

More about the annual fund: primary funding source for Foundation grants and activities. Contributions are credited to individual donors for Paull Harris credit. Contributions are credited to donor's club and the club's goals. Support local and international grants through the SHARE programs.

Basic education and literacy

Economics and community development
