They roast coffees for businesses such as Texas Live!, Mercury Chophouse, Savor Coffee and others. They opened their actual store front, coffee shop at 400 E. Division Street. Like many small businesses she and John have had to adjust and 'navigate' their business in these trying times of a pandemic. They offer to go coffee in disposable cups. They offer gift cards. They offer coffee in a variety of sizes which they will roast upon order and that can be enjoyed in your own home. They ship their coffees nationwide. Cindy stated that coffee is a 'connector' and we as a community are in need of connecting with each other. The website for the business is <u>www.salterbros.com</u>

Cindy then answered a variety of questions from Rotarians from how to choose the correct 'grind' for the correct drip to which coffee has the most caffeine. Cindy proved herself to be a true coffee expert. She shared that the more coffee is roasted the less caffeine it contains. A coffee taster does not have a fancy name like a sommelier (wine taster) but can provide a lot of entertainment in how to 'test the flavors' of coffees in classes titled "Coffee cupping 101". The name for a coffee taster is a Q grader. Again, Cindy Salter was a true coffee expert and is an asset to our city. She helps keep us alert and full of flavor.

President Susie presented Cindy with the book "Freda- A Girl and Her Dream" which will be placed in the Webb Elementary library in her name.

There was time for Kris Landrith to share a last laugh. All I can say is please keep Kris' wife, Ellen, in your thoughts as she deals with Kris. And if you have time, volunteer to help Ellen clean Kris' clock – I mean organize and clean his closets.
