commissioned by the Arlington City Council. The back story is that in the wake of the murder of George Floyd, a black man by Derek Chauvin, a white police officer and the ensuing national outcry of the people; the Arlington City Council, passed resolution #20-147 (as well as multiple others) on June 9, 2020 "affirming The City of Arlington's commitment to equity for its residents of all racial, ethnic and national origins."

That same month, The Arlington Police Department updated its use of force policies in alignment with #8CANTWAIT Project, a national movement for reform of policies and procedures in police departments all over the United States.

On June 23, 2020, The Arlington City Council established "The Unity Council" whose task was to gather data, and to study, to make recommendations to city leaders for making changes within our city to promote and encourage greater equality and equity for its citizens. Thus Dr. Shelton, highly qualified in the study of sociology, research and leadership, accepted the chairperson position. Local citizens, business owners and leaders make up the body of the committee.

The scope of analysis for evaluation includes: economic disparities, education and workforce training, housing, health and wellness, policing and criminal justice. Quantitative analysis comes from city statistics, US census, Arlington demographic and economic data, police reports, city real estate and housing records, AISD data, etc. Qualitative analysis is obtained through focus groups, town hall meetings, interviews with local citizens, pastors, business owners and community leaders. The deadline for the compilation of all the data, its analysis and recommendations is due to be presented to the mayor and city council February 2021! Needless to say, this is a daunting task.

Dr. Shelton gave some preliminary results of the findings; although it is too early for a comprehensive report until all the information been compiled. Those of us who live and work in Arlington must wait until February to savor the
