He may be the last living person in an iron lung. The challenge is for every Rotarian to make a \$50 donation; a link is in the Hubcap. With your \$50 donation, you will receive Paul Alexander's book.

Sally Hopper wished a Happy Birthday and Anniversary to Rotarians who celebrated over the last two weeks.

Bryan Roberts introduced a Classification Talk by LeeAnne Chenoweth Lawson. LeeAnne is a graduate of SMU Meadows School of Arts with a Bachelor's Degree in Violin Performance. When she was growing up, LeeAnne's dad was a pianist and her mother an opera singer. LeeAnne did not waste any time joining her musically inclined family and at the age of five she started violin lessons. LeeAnne was with the Fort Worth Symphony from 1990-2007. In 2007 LeeAnne imagined a chamber music series and began to create it. It is now Timeless Concerts. Along with Timeless Concerts, LeeAnne substitutes for the Dallas Symphony Orchestra and is a regular with the Waco Symphony Orchestra.

President Susie introduced our program, President and CEO of Arlington Convention and Visitors Bureau, Ron Price.

Ron gave an update of what Arlington looked like prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, what the current culture for Arlington is and what the city is looking forward to in the near future.

Prior to COVID-19 Arlington was the top tourist destination in North Texas. In 2017 there were 14.5 million visitors to the City of Arlington; preceding the pandemic in 2018-2019 the city was up to 17-18 million visitors. Ron mentioned that when he came to Arlington in 2013 the City of Arlington had only around 2 million visitors each year.

The COVID-19 pandemic had a greater impact on tourism than on any other sector of industry in the city. Immediately Ron and his team at the Arlington Convention and Visitors Bureau had to reposition themselves to adapt to the pandemic. They made the decision early on that Arlington would be the most successful city coming out of the pandemic. To do so the Arlington Convention and Visitors Bureau had to make sure that the city convened in a very safe way that allowed the economy to keep moving. Rule one, no one could get sick; and rule two, get people back to work.

To start the process of preserving the City of Arlington's health the city strived to create a safe and healthy environment with proper processes and guidelines per the CDC. To take it a step further, the City of Arlington convened the first Global Biorisk Advisory Council in the country to promote safety and transparency. This helped to start crafting a story proving the city's ability to safely host events. By being aggressive with protocol and safety Arlington was able to host the Major League Baseball World Series with fans, bringing revenue back into the city. Following that event, the City of Arlington was able to host the Professional Bull Riders' World Finals & National Finals Rodeo. Las Vegas opted not to host either event. Lastly, the City of Arlington was able to host the Rose Bowl.

Looking forward, the City of Arlington is able to host FEMA and mass vaccination centers. Hotels are opening back up and restaurants are creating new employment opportunities. The city is also looking forward to hosting WrestleMania again in 2022 as well as the World Cup Finals and possibly the Super Bowl in 2024 or 2026.

Arlington did in fact come in as the most successful destination amid the COVID-19 pandemic. In the words of this next week's guest and City of Arlington Mayor Jeff Williams, Arlington stayed strong!
