2021 he will be present at Grounds and Gold Co., a coffee shop at 4130 South Bowen Road in Arlington, to distribute copies of *Three Minutes for a Dog: My Life in an Iron Lung*, a book authored by recent Rotary program presenter Paul R. Alexander. The club will contribute proceeds from the books' sales to the Rotary Foundation.

Kim Crawford introduced our speakers: Ryan Dodson and Alex Bryant, both of Dodson Commercial Real Estate firm. The firm offers both commercial real estate and property management services. Ryan spoke at length regarding their two real estate projects in downtown Arlington, an area they believe offers opportunities for redevelopment. One is Urban Union, a restaurant, office and retail destination at 500 East Division Street which opened in 2017. Urban Union began as Luke Honda, an automobile dealership, which Dodson Commercial has now redeveloped. It is still a collection of metal and cinderblock buildings and is still near railroad tracks. However, Ryan noted

that his organization does not want to rebuild or tear down anything. Rather, the objective is to be creative and to breath new life into the area.

The project includes Legal Draft Beer Co., a brewery. Mr. Luke's former business office now houses Dodson Commercial's real estate office. A former body shop on the property now houses Sugar Bee Sweets; Cartel Taco Bar; Inspirations Catering; Lone Star Axe Throwing; and Camp TUF, a gym. The Tipsy Oak occupies another location within the project and has generated among the highest per-squarefoot sales tax revenue in the area.

The idea behind the project is to create a unique downtown" destination "only in that is distinguishable from other retail developments. project's "development themes" include The creative/urban design, unique materials, green spaces and patios, density and interest, connectivity, placemaking/public spaces, mixed use, funky and cool and walkable. Metal and cinderblock buildings have been preserved even though some of the materials with which they were constructed no longer comply local building codes. This has remediation, required asbestos brownfield remediation. Texas Commission on Environmental Quality qualification and other, similar tasks. The objective is to preserve the unique aspects of the buildings.

The businesses in the project have survived the Covid-19 pandemic in part because they offer patios for outdoor dining, drinking and other activity. The project seeks a diversity of uses, including office space, restaurants, bars and other things. At present Dodson Commercial is looking for a sushi restaurant, a yoga facility, a hair salon and other businesses that will make the project more cool and funky. New buildings are planned for the project. Ryan hopes to recruit great businesses that do not compete directly with current tenants. The idea is to offer businesses that offer complimentary goods and services to customers and that promote no

more than friendly competition. Dodson Commercial also plans a second downtown redevelopment project on East Front Street, also a commercial area near our city's railroad tracks. They hope to open twenty small shop spaces that will house "street businesses" along wide sidewalks with trees, green space, attractive street lights and ample parking. They also hope to build loft apartments on the second floor that recent UTA graduates seeking a funky, urban dwelling might lease. Again, the idea is to make it a cool area and, perhaps, something like the Main Street we lost long ago.

There is also some hope that one of these projects will include a seasonal farmers' market that is open six weeks twice a year. There is also an intention to shut down traffic on Front Street occasionally and to have art festivals there. President Susie thanked Ryan for his presentation and for the gift to Arlington that are these projects. She also announced that to thank Ryan for his presentation and to honor him the club will donate to the Webb library in his name a book on Henry Ford. President-Elect Kurt Bartley announced that Dr. Jim Quick, a member of our club, and former Rotary Peace Fellow Jeff Whitley will present next week's program.
