President Elect Victoria Farrar Myers introduced the program, Jennifer Savage Hurley of Arlington Foodies. Jennifer is a 4th generation Arlington native, growing up in her grandparents Christian Book Center in downtown Arlington. Her grandfather, affectionately named Poppy became one of her biggest influences. Teaching her three powerful life skills; one, food is beautiful and spiritual. Two, helping others is essential and lastly, support small, local business.

Seven years ago, Jennifer recognized that Arlington's small business restaurants needed help. In 2016, Jennifer asked herself "How do you promote restaurants/small businesses" her response was in the form of 501c3 nonprofit organization, Arlington Foodies (Foodies). Foodies is a community designed to support local, small restaurants. Main goal is to build a better community, building relationships between restaurants, consumers and the community all while promoting positivity. Per Webster's Dictionary, Foodies is defined as a person who enjoys and cares about food very much, Jennifer assures everyone they take on the literal word!

Foodies hosts Swarm Events; per their website this is a "reward" system for the restaurant for whom we hold in high regard. With three types of Swarms; Value Swarm, Swarm Choice Award and Best of Swarm. Then they "blow up" their social media by leaving pictures and reviews. Foodies has also started a monthly Farmers Market held at Centennial Park; hosting up to 95 vendors.

Covid was hard on the service industry and as the service industry navigated the pandemic, Foodies stepped in beside them to support & encourage them. Foodies used their social media platforms to spread information on the small, local restaurants; which were open, which were offering curbside, take out, mask mandates, etc. Foodies also promoted family style restaurant packages that the restaurants offered to try to get them in front of more people.
