Don Mebus announced that Rotary International had just announced its Presidential nominee for 2022-2023 is Jennifer Jones, the first woman to ever be President of RI. Sally Hopper recognized the birthdays of Jerry McCullough, Sam Scott and Don Mebus this week. Rotarians celebrating anniversaries are Heather Kipker (2), Timothy Israel (4), Tim Moloney (10) and Sally Hopper (21). Birthday checks to the Rotary Foundation were received from President Susie and Sam Scott. Sally also donated in honor of her Rotary anniversary.

Randy Hendricks introduced fellow Rotarian and Arlington Mayor Jeff Williams as our speaker. Jeff thanked us for all we do in the community and told us all to take good care of ourselves! He said Arlington is now a leader in America in Innovation! He went on to tell about incredibly interesting and innovative things happening right here in the 46<sup>th</sup> largest city in America. We recently were awarded the Gold Level in What Works Cities. Only eight other American cities and no other Texas cities have this distinction. We were the first City to have a public shuttle, named Milo. It has proven to be both cheaper and safer to operate than other transportation modalities. Now an unmanned air taxi is being developed (Yikes!) The Arlington Air Port is one of the first to test this with Bell (formerly Bell Helicopter). A hyperloop to DFW is being explored with a metro stop in Arlington and eventually on to Houston. An elevated autonomous transit is being explored like that at DFW currently. General Motors will be the test site for this. VIA ride share program has been a huge success. When we had a bus system, we had about 100 riders a day and with VIA there are currently1,000 daily riders at a much lower expense to the city and much more

personalized service. It will soon be expanded to the entire city. They have been working on a much "smarter" traffic light system. Roads will be much more efficient. Waze has also recently in Arlington using it as a test site. The "Ask Arlington" app has been developed to report pot holes and more. Information you report is sent directly to the road crews for repair. We are also changing to LED streetlights which are much brighter and cheaper to use. UTA developed an underground robot to determine the condition of sewer pipes. The robot saves the City millions. The new Medal of Honor Museum is working on incredible technology in their displays. We also have the largest E-Sports venue in the nation in what use to be the ballroom of the Convention Center. E-Sports is a very big and growing industry. Arlington is truly a national leader innovation! It was a fabulous program!! The Mayor also took questions on the Term Limits Issue. He noted it was discovered by the committee that we voted in the most restrictive policy in the entire nation. Voters will have a choice but who is to say many won't like a less restrictive policy. Voters will have a choice to remain like it is or make changes.

President Susie presented Mayor Williams with a book for the Webb Library entitled, "Diary of an Awesome, Friendly Kid." Kris gave us a really good Last Laugh. We finished with the Four Way Test and President Susie adjourned us, not by ringing the Rotary Bell which she wasn't able to get to, but by banging the gavel against a skillet! 
### **Unmanned Air Taxi**
