CCORDING TO ROTARY INTERNATIONAL, THE 1989 COUNCIL ON LEGISLATION VOTED TO ADMIT WOMEN into Rotary clubs worldwide, which remains a watershed moment in the history of Rotary. The response to the decision was overwhelming. By June 1990, the number of female Rotarians had skyrocketed to over 20,000. By July 2016, the number of women worldwide had surpassed 250,000. Women immediately embraced the leadership opportunities provided by their clubs.

In 1991, the Rotary Club of Arlington inducted their first female member, Mary Jean Moloney, who remains an active member today. In the 97 years of our club's existence, we have only had 5 female club presidents. The first was Lisann Peters in 2006. Other past female club presidents are Joyce Stanton, Valerie Landry, and Mary Tom Curnutt, and I serve as the fifth. Women are an important part of Rotary especially in this age of diversity and inclusion. Our club now has 33% females, all of which are quality members. Let us continue to bring in quality members, both male and female, to further advance our great club.

Now, <u>lennifer lones</u> has been nominated to become RI president for 2022-23, the first female named to that office in Rotary's 115-year history. Our own PRID, Don Mebus, has worked with her and has some kind things say in his article on the next page.

President-elect Kurt Bartley introduced our guest speaker, Jim Baker, Director of Intercollegiate Athletics at the University of Texas at Arlington. UTA's 2019-2020 spring athletics season was in full swing when it was cut short due to COVID-19. Baker was slated with the unenviable task of calling both softball and baseball teams in off the road, advising them to return to campus due to Covid-19 restrictions. Despite an abbreviated season, and the demands of adjusting to an online learning environment, UTA athletes managed to produce an impressive cumulative Spring GPA of 3.4. Each of UTA's 15 athletic teams produced GPAs in excess of 3.0, making it the 13th straight semester that UTA student athletes produced better than a 3.0 cumulative GPA.

The Sunbelt Conference (of which UTA is a part) is carefully weighing factors to determine if fall championships will continue or be cancelled due to the pandemic. Coach Baker stated that regardless of other COVID-related departmental budget cuts, funding to Student Athlete Welfare (such as nutrition, sports medicine, tutoring, etc) will not be cut, and that the department and university are continually monitoring the situation to ensure the health and safety of all student athletes. He praised both staff and administration for the seamless transition to online learning in the spring, and for their continued dedication to a safe hybrid learning environment for the fall semester. All returning student athletes and Athletics staff must undergo COVID testing prior to their return to campus. Once there, the athletes live, study and work in pods to ensure continued health and safety.

The Athletics master plan involves partnering with UTA alumni and members of the campus and surrounding communities to upgrade UTA's older existing sports facilities for wider university and community use. Both the university and the greater Arlington community have, and continue to flourish as the result of such mutually beneficial partnerships.

President Susie led us in the Four Way Test and we were adjourned. Join us next week as we welcome our own, Maggie Campbell, President and CEO of Downtown Arlington Inc.


