Did you know our club works closely with Webb Elementary in a variety of ways? Tom Ware reported on one such project this past week – eBooks. He updated us that the librarian at Webb had purchased 461 eBooks these past few months and has \$4,500 remaining from the initial grant of \$12,000. As this summer was the first time for eBooks, there were 67 first time checkouts. One of the unintended consequences of this project is that parents are having their children checkout an eBook so they can learn English!

Scott Hendricks reported on a second such project – we received a district grant to purchase uniforms both at Webb Elementary and Nichols Jr. High. We received District Designated Funds of \$4,323 to be matched with funds from our club of \$4,323 for a total grant to purchase uniforms of \$8,646. This will be split 60% Webb and 40% Nichols. This is how your Rotary donations are being put to work.




Amanda told us that the board consists of servant

leaders. The goal of AEF is to listen to classroom teachers and try to meet their needs. The goal is to build strong student outcomes. AEF provides leading edge learning tools to maximize student opportunities. AEF supports the ARLO Bookmobile. ARLO is the acronym for Arlington Raises Literacy Outcomes. ARLO provides free books in order to increase literacy. Another grant from AEF funded a robotics team at the Dan Dipert CTC Center. The team was known as the Wild Cards, aka The Fighting Ferrets. This team was able to compete in San Antonio in June, 2021.

Some of the fundraisers of the AEF include the Dream Makers Banquet and AISD Plate Project. A virtual bingo night was held in October, 2020 and a "Grease" movie night at The Levitt Pavilion. Over 500 people attended and \$145,000.00 was raised. Amanda also informed us about a fundraiser that has raised over \$1 million in seven years. This fundraiser was the brainchild of Chad and Joy Bates. It is the Education Celebration held annually at Six Flags Over Texas. The most recent event was just held on Friday, September 17.
