- What extra-curricular interests and activities do you enjoy? Are you involved in other community organizations?
- Why did you join Rotary (and when?, if you are a long-term Rotarian). What have you gotten out of Rotary, what Rotary assignments have you accomplished, and what do you hope to get out of Rotary in the future?

Obviously you can't hope to do all of this in only 10 minutes. The club president is always pushed for time and will gently let you know if you run over. Time is your biggest challenge, so be selective in how much you try to cover. Even those who go so far as to practice find that it takes 20% longer to get it done when at the podium.
