Named for Mineral Wells Police officer Tommy Parker and volunteer fireman who died while fighting a fire in 1992, the event raises money and Christmas gifts for needy children in Palo Pinto County.

In 2009, the event helped 791 kids, in 2010 there were 600+ kids helped and so far almost 500 are on the list for Santa to visit. In 2010 there were 200 names left on the tree and cash donations were used to purchase gifts for them. The funds usually provides \$25-\$35 per remaining child to buy the extra presents. The program benefits children from 0-12 years of age and they must go through an application process. They must show birth certificate, Social Security No. and income level proof. They must be a resident of Palo Pinto County. The list is checked against names on other angel trees as there can be no duplications.

Earl Medlin suggested a basket be passed for member donations.

A wonderful program in memory of a good man.
