ROBIN BRAND Why Did I Join Rotary?



Each month a featured Four Peaks Rotary Club member gets up close and personal by answering the question: **Why Did I Join Rotary?**

For December, please welcome **Robin Brand** as she recounts her path to Fountain Hills and Four Peaks Rotary, and the benefits of giving back.

When I was notified last month that I had been selected to be featured as the Four Peaks Rotarian of the Month for December, I was thrilled and honored to be able to tell my story as to how I found my way to joining Four Peaks Rotary.

My story begins back when I was still an undergraduate doing Field Work to earn my Bachelors Degree at the State University of New York at Plattsburgh and one of my last projects was a position at one of the first Cable TV

channels in Albany, New York. My job was to develop, produce and execute a Morning Program similar to what we have here in Arizona such as Arizona Morning or Capital District Living, as my show was called.

One of my first guests on the show as a woman who was an executive with Price Chopper Grocery Stores in the Albany area. She was also a member of the Albany City Council and was a member of the Women's Auxillary to a local service club as well. As a young person on the brink of graduating from college with my adult life about to begin, I was so impressed and fascinated with what she had done with her life and career as well as to be able to contribute her skills and talents to help others realize theirs.

A year later, I found myself in Jackson, Tennessee, where I had landed a position with Holiday Inn, Inc. as the Banquet/Catering Manager for that particular property. Every Civic Club in town met at this particular facility, including, Rotary, Civitan, Lion's Club, Elks Club, etc.

What I noticed and found interesting at this particular time, was that these clubs were exclusive to business men only with no female members at all. Here, in Jackson, TN, women had their own clubs, but if there were Women's Auxillaries to any of the local men's service clubs, that's where they were. The chuckle to me now is that over time, rules have changed and many of these clubs are now open to women and we all work together to pool our experience, talents and resources to serve others and help better their lives with opportunities to grow and flourish.

Fast forward more than 30 years later and I found myself in Fountain Hills, AZ, where I have been a town resident for most of that time. Many of my friends and colleagues have been active in and with the Town for various projects and service opportunities, but I was never able to participate to the degree that I wanted, due to the nature of my business and circumstances surrounding.

Enter Art Tolis. I've known Art Tolis since he arrived in Fountain Hills in 2002 and opened his first mortgage business, Saguaro Blossom Mortgage. Art and I are both affiliates of the Real Estate community and he and I have participated and contributed to that field locally and became good friends as well. In May 2017, I ran in to Art at Safeway and he was in dress pants, a white shirt and was carrying a rose. I asked him where he was going and he said that he was going to the In-and-Out Party for the Four Peaks Rotary. We visited for a while and he suggested that I think about joining. I thought, Why Not? I should join. There was no reason why I shouldn't!

I've now been a member for just over two (2) years and I am thrilled to be part of such a dynamic group! Since joining, I've volunteered to pick up trash at the Art Fairs, I've worked on the float for the Thanksgiving Day Parade, I've worked with the Social Committee to help plan various events and Holiday Parties and have been able to give back to the community and help others less fortunate. It feels GOOD to give back and live up to our motto, Service Above Self.


