For January, please welcome **Chris Enos** as he recounts his path to Fountain Hills and Four Peaks Rotary, and the benefits of giving back—in spite of the rigors of oddly named brews and picking up trash!

It was 2015. We had been in Fountain Hills since September, 2014.

I was still working from my law practice in New York — six months here - six months there. At the same time, I had been trying to set roots here. The back and forth was getting old. A change was needed.

A realty guy we met in our home search was more than willing to help us.

We talked about how to get established in a new community. "Everybody here is from somewhere else," said the former mayor. He offered, "If you want to establish yourself here — meet new people — I've got just the thing —Rotary!" I learned that Rotary had been started by a group of businessmen who wanted generate business contacts while doing some good. It sounded perfect.

There were introductory breakfasts. The bi-weekly meetings were early, but the people were welcoming. It was a rough cross between a pub and a church. Kind of fun. Only later on, as I had been warned, did it become apparent why this was called a "service organization."

There was setting up and organizing golfers. There was picking up bags of festival trash while people would try to stuff more in — even as you were trying to close the darn thing. There was a beer fest. You tried to keep up with an unceasing demand for oddly named brews. Then, finally, there was another festival, and more trash. Always, always, there was trash.

The odd thing was that, once you were done with it, it hadn't really been all that bad. This was mostly because of the people who had been involved with you — your fellow Rotarians. Of course, that was it. Rotary is the people, united by a goal.

There is something special about bringing together so many imperfect people with different backgrounds. It became clear that we can work together when there's a view toward common goals.

So, maybe things didn't really work out exactly the way that I had first thought they might. It doesn't matter. I found something bigger than my personal goals. And, in doing so, I achieved what I had set out to do. We are established. We found a house. There are fewer trips to New York.

I now know that Rotary is an essential part of where we live. I am grateful to be a part of it -despite the trash!

Club member Bill Pape has a valuable message: Don't miss out on donating to the Rotary Vocational Fund.

According to Bill and other Club members, "It costs us NOTHING, since we get a tax credit with the State and helps to fund those folks who really need the help."

The mission of **The Rotary Vocational Fund of Arizona**, Inc. (TRVFA) is to partner with Rotary Clubs to provide assistance to Qualified Candidates in obtaining education, training, and skill development so they may, in turn, attain career oriented employment and financial stability and contribute to their communities.

The vision is for students go on to become productive citizens in our state. The education they obtain will help them earn a living and raise their families. Because of their increased earning potential they help grow the economy of the state of Arizona.

TRVFA is a Vocational Service opportunity uniquely available to Arizona Rotarians because of the Arizona tax credit opportunity which allows citizens to direct where some of their tax dollars are used. Board members are enthusiastically ready, willing, and able to visit clubs and raise awareness. It is hoped that in doing so, support will increase and expand the capacity of TRVFA to serve more students. If fundraising in the coming months is abundant, the Board might eventually be able to increase the maximum available grant back to \$3,000 or more.

Original 'Rotary Ann' Member Pat Tuttle Featured in Premiere Issue of 'Fountain Hills Live'

The Four Peaks Rotary Club is busily organizing its 22nd annual *Charity for Golf* tournament scheduled for March 2, 2020 at the Ancala Country Club, but the event is more than just an opportunity for area golfers to get together and have a good time.

The outing is one of the primary activities the club uses to raise money for youth organizations in the Fountain Hills community. Proceeds are used to support programs such as Junior Achievement, the Golden Eagle Education Fountain, the Mentor Program, Rotary exchange students, the Teacher of the Month, and Casa Esperanza.

"The compassion the Club has for children and youth is outstanding," Pat Tuttle, Four Peaks Club member said. "We've made an impact on the Town. I'm proud to say, yes, I am a Rotarian."

Pat, an original "Rotary Ann", was one of the first women to become a Rotarian in 1988, a year after the Supreme Court ruled that private clubs did not have a constitutional right to exclude women from membership. She and her husband, Roy, were among the founding members of the Four Peaks Rotary Club after they became full-time residents of Fountain Hills in 1996.

The Four Peaks Club received its charter in 1997; other founding members include Bill Beamish, Paul Perrault, Dick Bower, and Roger Riggert.

The Club's Foundation has contributed in the past to the group *Free the Kids*. Club member Jack Reynolds, a *Free the Kids* board member, reports that the Espwa orphanage in Haiti continues to suffer the effects of country-wide famine. "The orphanage is rationing food by serving smaller portions as well as two meals per day vs. three," he says.

"We are the only agency in the southern region of Haiti that has food in our depot and the locals know that.," Jack continues. "Hence when we hear of a very destitute situation outside our campus, we provide relief to that family.

Kudos to the work Jack Reynolds does for Espwa and *Free the Kids*. And kudos to all members of Four Peaks Rotary who through their diligent fundraising, helps support incredible organizations such as *Free the Kids*.
