September 12 Meeting to Highlight Club's Navajo Water Project Updates

Curt Ward, Rotarian from the Gilbert Club, will be the featured speaker at Thursday's Four Peaks meeting.

Curt will share his experience spearheading Rotary's efforts to improve water efficiency for the Navajo Nation and how Four Peaks Rotary can provide funds and people power to accelerate Rotary's effort to improve the lives of thousands of people who live without running water.

Curt's remarks will echo the story found on page three in which District Governor David Simmer cites stunning statistics on the Navajo Nation and the reasons why Rotary is doing what it can to provide the necessary resources to help bring relief for over 200,000 Navajo people.

Before I retired, I owned a software development company that had a worldwide presence. Our software was installed in mostly Fortune 1000 companies, throughout the USA, Europe, South America, and Australia. After retirement, I looked at my community to see where I could redirect my energy to help improve the lives of my fellow residents of Fountain Hills.

I have participated in community enhancement programs that have helped bring Oktoberfest, the Irish Fest, and 4th of July festivals back to the Fountain Park. As President of Fountain Hills Veterans Memorial, Inc., I have helped keep our memorial in a condition that honors the sacrifice of our armed service members.


I have always been involved in veteran's assistance programs and I volunteered for three years at the Phoenix Veterans Medical Center inputting billing records for veterans who had received service outside the VA System. Since leaving that position, I have concentrated my efforts on making sure that our veterans receive the care they have earned through their service.

Joining the Four Peaks Rotary gave me an additional opportunity to give back to my community. The Rotary collects trash during the fairs, serves beer at Oktoberfest, and contributes to bettering our community in innumerable ways. I am proud to be a part of this great organization that does so much to make our community a better place to live. All the money raised through these efforts goes to making our community a better place to live

Step For
Running
Water
in Navajo
Nation



According to District 5495 Governor David Simmer, "Rotary's Navajo Water Project has received wonderful interest and support from almost all the clubs I have visited so far. That is not totally surprising as it benefits residents right here in Arizona who have lived for years without running water in their homes."

Simmer is calling attention to this project now so that Rotarians can make decisions about allocating limited resources among the many compelling projects for this current fiscal year.

Over the last three years Rotary clubs in District 5495 have helped finance the work to bring clean running water to residents of the Navajo Reservation. **Four Peaks Rotary** is hosting the next step of this project to fund water installations in homes in and around Dilkon, Arizona.

Here are stunning statistics:

Navajo Population:

- Approximately 200,000 Navajo live in an area of 24k square miles with roughly half of that territory within northeast Arizona -- i.e. within our District
- It is estimated that 70 thousand (roughly 40%) of the Navajo live without indoor tap water and/or toilet
- A reported 44% of the children on the Reservation live in poverty

Comparative Information:

- The average American family uses 100 gallons of water per day
- The average Navajo family uses just seven (7) gallons of water per day
- That means that Navajo go two weeks on what other Americans use in a single day

Four Peaks Rotary Will Make a Difference

Paul Perreault, Roger Riggert, and Tim Taylor along with Club President Jeff Poynter will lead Four Peaks Rotary on this project which will begin in earnest in January. The goal is to outfit 138 Navajo households with wells to provide water, culminating in a \$750,000 outlay in funds. Households have already been chosen based on need.

Club leadership will meet September 26 with tribal leaders to outline logistics of the project.
