Fountain Hills Middle School Instructor Wins March 'Teacher of the Month' Award


Sarah Erickson, math teacher at Fountain Hills Middle School, won the Club's March "Teacher of Month" honor at the March 28 meeting.


A Look Back at Rotary's Roots
