In October of 1988 I was pleased to be invited to join Rotary and become a Rotarian.

In the 25 years that my husband Roy had been a Rotarian, I was already aware of the projects and meaning of Rotary at the local level.

In 1967 we attended our first District Conference, followed by many more. It was on this level that Rotary took on an enlarged perspective and involvement for me.

Our small club hosted exchange students annually. I became involved with them for the club as well as the District. Soon the local school board asked me to be the counselor for all Exchange students from other programs. Our oldest daughter was an Exchange student to Mexico and it was the best experience for her. As a family we hosted eight Exchange students.

Roy was District Governor in 1990-91 and as he made his official club visits, it became apparent the clubs did not know "what to do with me". I was the first District Governor wife as a Rotarian. It was the tradition to entertain her so sometimes I was, or sat in on the board meetings, shopped, and always carried a good book.

We were fortunate to be able to attend eight Rotary International Conferences. It is exciting to experience the international flavor of Rotary.

As we made the move to Fountain Hills we wanted to stay involved with Rotary and it was exciting to be part of the forming of and charter member of the Four Peaks club. The focus of Four Peaks with youth and the community involvement make a positive statement.

I am proud to be a member and treasure my Rotary family.
