# Bill Beamish Selected as Fountain Hills 'Volunteer of the Year' by Town Chamber of Commerce






# Final 'Teacher of the Month' Award Given at April Meeting

# Death of Silvester Schiele

IN December, 1945, Rotary International was saddened by the death of Rotarian Silvester Schiele of Chicago, one of the three men who with Paul Harris founded the Rotary Club of Chicago in 1905. Rotarian Schiele at the time of his death was serving as treasurer of R.I., having been elected to the office on the death of Rotary's long-time treasurer, Rufus F. Chapin, in June, 1945. With Silvester gone, only Paul is left of the four "original Rotarians."

And then there was just one. As the above blurb points out, following the death of Silvester Schiele, only Paul Harris was left as an original Rotarian. While Harris is beloved and renowned as a founder of Rotary, there were others – Silverster Schiele and Rufus Chapin -- among them, who guided and formed the Club from its very earliest years in Chicago.




