American Legion Post Members Present Program on New USS Arizona Sub

Chris Balsley, Bernie Gillis and Bob Wilford from American Legion Post 91 presented a program on the bell that is being designed to be part of the new USS Arizona submarine still under construction.

Chris is a Valley native and is an alternate member of the American Legion National Executive Committee. The trio presented a sample of the bell that will be included on the Arizona when it is launched.

The ship's crew has visited the Valley three times recently, although the crew changes frequently and this crew is not likely to be the one that serves aboard ship when it is launched.

The Legionaires have been collecting grommets from American flags, etc., melting them down to formulate the metal that will be used to create the bell. Three models of the bell will be created and judged before the final version is accepted.

There have been three models so far. They brought along one of them for all to see. The final bell will weigh 22 pounds. There is a plan to make smaller models to sell as a fund raiser.

The Legion post is collecting American flags that are no longer acceptable to fly. They use the grommets from these as well as other sources. They have one from the original USS Arizona in Hawaii.

The trio discussed flag etiquette, when a flag should no longer be used, the proper way to fly a flag, etc. If you have a used flag you would like to retire, you can drop it off at the Legion post, 922 North Alma School Road in Chandler. They are open daily from 12 noon until close.

The models have been a combination of

brass and copper, although they are generally about 78 percent copper. They recently received a donation of 100 pounds of copper from a local firm. They look for a good sound from the bells they create.

The trio brought along several memorabilia items that were raffled off to CHRC members, including tee shirts, lanyards and medallions in the shape of the state of Arizona with the new sub highlighted.

Tanya Wheelless presented a program on the new Arizona sub back on September 27, 2023. She told us about the attack on Pearl Harbor and the plans for the construction of the new sub.

Our thanks to the vets from the Legion post for their service and for their update, noting that the project has been delayed by a couple of years, but still is going forward.

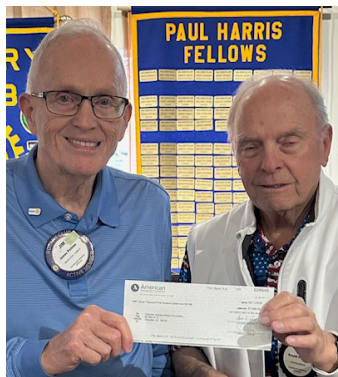
