It costs \$10,000 per year to pay for the use of the fields, primarily the lights. Uniforms are donated by the Arizona Diamondbacks, but the league has to put numbers on the uniforms.

They don't have team sponsors as such, but they are in need of financial support in whatever form. The cost is \$150 per player.
