John Gombier, Chandler's new City Manager, told us about his past and how he plans to handle his new job with the city

A graduate of the University of Michigan and the ASU Law School, John has served in several capacities in the Valley during the past several years.

He has worked in the Attorney General's office as well as in the office of Governor Jane Hull. He also worked for Amazon for 2 1/2 years.

He is married with three children.

Why Chandler? He feels Chandler is a great community with a lot to offer. He said he works for his employees and not the council and other forces.

John noted that Chandler has a big election coming up that will involve the mayor and three members of the city council.

He talked about the \$475 million budget he recently presented to city council, one that will add several new positions within the city, those he feels can added with the support of the council and following a plan he has laid out.

One of the new positions he hopes to add is city ambulance service. He left five positions open so the council can add any one or all of those as it sees fit. He said these positions are very much needed, he can justify each and most eventually

John also works closely with the Chandler Chamber of Commerce, promoting the city and all it has to offer.

He talked about growth in the Valley of the Sun. He said Tempe is landlocked and that San Tan Valley is one of the fastest growing communities in the Valley.
