### Program

Local author Howard Gershkowitz returned last week to tell us about his first book, "Journey to Authorship." It is subtitled, "How Wannabe Writers Can Realize their Publishing Dreams."

He spoke to us a little more than a year ago about time management. This time he discussed the process he had to go through to become a published author, which involves more than you might think.

He was a financial advisor and stock broker prior to following his dream of becoming an author. During his earlier years he kept a journal of his daily activities.

"I must have 25,000 pages of journals," he said. "When I finally decided to become a published author, I went back to school and took classes that would help me."

He joined the Alliance for Literary Writers, Authors and Yabbering Scribes, an organization that provides assistance to would-be authors. He noted that if we have aspirations of becoming a published author, we should join an organization similar to that.

He said we should hire an editor and noted there are various kinds of editors, most of whom may be necessary to complete your goal. There
