Program

Harvey Newcomb III, Chair of Major Gifts for The Rotary Foundation, brought us up-to-date on TRF. He was introduced by longtime friend Jim Patmos.

Harvey noted The Rotary Foundation has received a 4-Star rating from R4 Navigator for 16 straight years, meaning it is among the very best in terms of money donated being used for needy organizations. Eighty-seven percent contributed goes to programs.

The Rotary Foundation started as such in 1947. It actually began in 1917 when gifts started coming in to do good in the world.

He explained the way funds received can be used, most at the discretion of the giver. Donations given to the Annual Fund are frozen for three years, then 50 percent of the interest is made available to districts and on to clubs. TRF is working toward a \$2 billion endowment.

Grants can be small or very large such as the polio eradication project. All but two countries, Afghanistan and Pakistan, have been declared polio free. Funds are spent on a variety of projects around the world.

He thanked Jim and Mary Kay for their continued devotion to The Rotary Foundation.

Chandler Horizon Rotary Golf Classic Brings Out the Best

The Chandler Horizon Rotary Club's annual Golf Classic was held this past Saturday at San Marcos Golf Course.

There were 128 golfers who participated for the top three team prizes as well as several other events around the course.

New CHRC member Jonathan Downs was a member of the winning team that posted a score of 57 to win \$300. Other members of the team were Christoph Downs, Joe Harris and Brian Rhode.

The second place team was just one shot behind and won \$200. Members of the team were Anthony Liu, Octavio Valencia, Roger Arbisi and Kyle Stanifer.

The third place team won \$100 with a score of 59. They were Scott, Mark and Alexander Ward as well as James Sincinski. Trophies also were awarded the three team winners.

No one got a hole-in-one on Hole No. 8 that would have won a new car from Earnhardt Genesis in Gilbert.

However, Ryan Valenzuela's tee shot on Hole No. 3 was 103 inches from the pin and he won an eight-day, seven-night stay at a resort of his choice..

For the first time, only one ball

Raffle prizes included: a weekend trip for two to Las Vegas or Orlando; a combination prize from PGA Superstore; two PhoenixSuns tickets for the April 9 game against Oklahoma City with several amenities; Mongoose bicycle and driver combo; 65-inch TV with a foursome golf package and gift certificate; and an electric scooter.

The registration and organization of the event seems to get better every year. Everything went well.
