Soo Stevens-Clarke told us about her visit to Calgary, Alberta, Canada, where she attended the Rotary International Convention that was

held June 22-25, using the Rotary theme from last year of "The Magic of Ro-



tary." Emphasis of the convention was placed on the inclusion of women.

There were 16,000 Rotarians from 140 different countries attending the annual event, the largest since the COVID epidemic. The event was held at the BMO Center and the Scotiabank Stampede Center.

Soo had a PowerPoint presentation that produced more information about the convention. She attended the second seating of the Parade of Flags which produced flags from 220 countries. RI secretary John Hewko also spoke at the opening ceremony.

Outgoing RI President Stephanie Urchick presided over the event. Mark Maloney spoke about the new Rotary Peace Center in Pune, India. It was reported that \$2.025 billion has been raised for the Rotary endowment fund.

Incoming RI President Francesco Arrezo from Rugusa, Italy, also spoke, noting he was a late fill-in when the previously elected RI President was unable to serve. President Arrezo is keeping the orginal new theme for the year of "Unite for Good."

There were breakfast sessions every morning with individual breakout sessions each afternoon. Soo also told us about visiting the House of Friendship. There were many booths with information about many facets of Rotary, including Rotary Action Grants, and Rotary's seven avenues of service, among many others. A large

teepee was set up in the middle of the arena that highlighted indigenous people, particularly in Alberta and Saskatchewan.

One section highlighted Days for Girls, showing the plight of young girls, particuladty in underserved nations. Soo brought back a packet that was created and included my items girls need for their own health particularly during their once a month menstrual periods. She would like to see Chandler Horizon Rotary seek a \$500 grant to support this project.

Visitor John Orr told us how acute the problem is even here is Arizona, particularly among indigenous people.

Soo told us about other ongoing projects, including: End Polio Now and looking for more areas to serve: reducing carbon footprint; the installation of more Peace Poles, possibly including a Peace Park that would include may Peace Poles; and events leading up to the 250th birthday of the United States.

Soo noted the upcoming Mexi-

co-America Peace Conference that is scheduled October 31 - November 3 in Yuma.

The 2026 Rotary International Convention is scheduled from June 13-17 in Taipei, Taiwan.

We thank Soo for her report and her continued dedication to Rotary.
