Program

Haydn Janus, general manager of Majestic Theater in Chandler, told us about the movie industry today. The program was arranged by Lori Pierce.

He talked about special programming offered by Majestic, that also has locations in Gilbert and Tempe. Haydn has been involved in the movie industry for many years. He said the COVID pandemic caused many theaters to fold while others were forced to make changes to survive.

Haydn worked with the Landmark theater group in California. He noted that Majestic is one of the Top 100 businesses in Chandler. They are located at 4955 South Arizona Avenue, just north of Chandler Heights Drive.

They have nine screens. They show a variety of movies from current releases to classic films to kiddie flicks. They have rocker and recliner seats and seat-side service. It is ADA compliant.

They combine a movie theater with a restaurant with a variety of menu items including such traditional fare as popcorn, candy and soda. They also offer pizza, burgers and other sandwiches, fish and chips and other food items, plus a variety of beverages, from soda to beer and wine, and a selection of dessert offerings.

General admission is \$12. The weekday matinee (before 5 p.m.) price is \$8.50 while senior, students and children plus military and first responders pay \$9. They have a special \$5 Wednesday and a \$5 senior Tuesday.

Haydn explained the negotiation process in obtaining films to be shown. He said many people go to a restaurant for dinner and then take in a movie. Majestic offers both in one package with comfortable seating.
