Lana Berry Provides Information on Upcoming CUSD Bond Election

Lana Berry, Chief Financial Officer of the Chandler Unified School District, joined us last week to talk about the financial situation of CUSD with special emphasis on the upcoming bond election on November 5. The program was arranged by Terry Locke. Lana, who has appeared with us on previous occasions, thanked Terry for his support before his recent retirement.

Lana noted that prior to the 1980s funding of schools depended on the wealth of the district. Now it is commanded that every child receives the same amount. She said there are two options for raising funds: override, which Chandler has done for decades; and a bond election like the one that will take place in November. She had a handout that explained many of the issues.

The bond hopes to do three things: **Maintain**, including structural repairs, maintenance projects, cooling systems, playgrounds, fields and classroom furniture; **Modernize**, including updated technology, equipment, plus safety and security measures; and **Maximize**, support the CUSD's ability to be innovative and prepared for the future.

The CUSD has 43,000 students covering 1,000 acres, 80 square miles and 5.5 million square feet. It is the second largest employer in Chandler, behind only Intel; and the second largest district in Arizona, behind only Mesa.

She said the CUSD does not expect a tax rate increase compared to the current bond tax rate based on current and projected property values and their plan for issuance of bonds. The estimated average tax rate for the proposed bond is 41¢ per \$100 of assessed valuation.

If approved, the bond will be broken down in the following ways: \$310.8 million for construction; \$125.12 million for technology; \$39.5 million for equipment; and \$12 million for transportation. The bond will not impact teacher or staff salaries.

Lana said the CUSD serves 26 public schools plus 11 private schools in Chandler, Gilbert and Queen Creek. They send out 250 busses every day that cost \$250,000 each. There was talk about going electric, but that would create additional problems

not to mention the initial \$500,000 cost each. She said many schools are more than 25 years old and there is wear and tear on equipment throughout.

The goal is that every child eventually will have his/her own computer. She also noted that Chandler is built out and birth rates are down.

She noted several CUSD accomplishments: 91 percent four-year graduation rate (well above state average); 7,900 advance placement exams taken in 2023; 1,100 AP scholars; 208 National Merit finalists in the last five years; 224 athletic state championships in the last five years; \$199 million in scholarships awarded to seniors in 2024; and 22,500 hours of dual-enrollment college credits in 2024.

Lana was reminded that since Rotary is neutral, she could urge us to vote but not how to vote. She thanked us for the opportunity to present information about the bond issue.
