Program

Carolyn Englehart, a 22-year Navy veteran and for the last nine years the grocery manager at the Fry's store at Val Vista and Warner in Gilbert, told us about her experiences. She was introduced by Ron Stevens who has worked with Carolyn on our summer water project.

A native of Los Angeles, Carolyn joined the Navy at 17 and did boot camp in Orlando, Florida. She described it as culture shock. She earned a Master at Arms rating and was stationed in such places as the Philippines and Cuba, where a volcano erupted while she was there.

After leaving the service she was married. She has two daughters, the younger of whom is a student at Texas A&M. She worked in Downey, California, and Prescott for a while.

As Grocery Manager she is responsible for ordering grocery items and stocking the shelves on a daily basis, usually overnight. She starts at 10 p.m. and finishes work somewhere between 2 and 3 p.m. She has a crew of six, although they are frequently shorthanded and she has to pick up the slack. Her crew stocks everything except produce, dairy and bakery items. She noted certain vendors stock their own items.

Club Assembly

President Chuck Ertl will conduct a Club Assembly next week when we will discuss financial issues facing the club and foundation.

Board Meeting

The CHRC board of directors held its regular monthly meeting September 9.

The board accepted with regret the resignation of Ken Gudewich from the club. Ken cited increased business duties and other personal commitments affecting his ability to attend meetings as the reason.

The board also accepted with regret the resignation from the board and also as President Elect from James DeVary, who has two children attending different schools making it difficult for him to attend board meetings and assume the duties of president. He also is able to attend club meetings only for a short time each week.

On behalf of the Nominating Committee, Jim Hoenig announced that Lori Pierce has agreed to replace James on the board. The club will vote on her nomination next week.

The board also had lengthy discussion on both the club and foundation financial accounts. Larry Gardner noted that as our membership continues to decrease (with even more resignations on the horizon) we are losing money. We need to increase our membership in order to make ends meet or we may have to increase dues.

Jim Hoenig reported that available funds on the Foundation treasury are not as high as previously thought. There was discussion about possible fund raisers to increase the treasury.

Grants chair Soo Stevens-Clarke reported that CHRC has been awarded two grants for this year.

One is for the Precious Kids Foundation for \$3,700 that will be matched 2-for-1 by District 5495. Our share will be \$1,250.

The second is for the Chandler Unified School District's Operation Back to School project for \$2,000 that will be matched 1-for-1 by District 5495. Our share will be \$1,000.

The Foundation board was scheduled to meet Tuesday to discuss the situation. We will have a Club Assembly at next week's meeting to discuss ways these grants might be funded. They are due in April, 2025.

Several Chandler Horizon Rotary Club members attended the memorial service at Healing Fields at Tempe Town Lake last Wednesday, the 23rd anniversary of the terrorist attack on the twin towers in New York City. CHRC Secretary Soo Stevens-Clarke offers her remembrance of the day's event.

As one arrived early in the morning, the field was buzzing with preparations by the various law enforcement and fire agencies present, airline personnel and the media.

The program started at 5:46 a.m., the time the first tower was struck. There were brief addresses by Tempe Mayor Corey Woods, plus members of Tempe Police and Fire.
