Program

Eugene Roberts, Assistant Manager of AZStRUT, told us about that organization. The program was arranged by Lori Pierce.

AZStRUT stands for Arizona Students Recycling Used Technology. The program began in 1997 as a concept by Intel and Motorola, who wanted to get used equipment to Arizona schools and non-profits that could benefit from them. In 1998 AZStRUT officially became a 501(c)3 with the state of Arizona and started providing A+ certification training to teachers and these programs.

AZStRUT has also supported STEM programs with computer hardware and continues to recycle all of the e-waste responsibly. More than 100,000 devices have been given to students and community members in need in the 25+ years since its creation. In 2023 alone, 1,064,000 pounds of electronics were saved from the landfill and 10,398

Sinner of the Year Award

James DeVary finally has received his trophy as winner of the 2023-2024 Chandler Horizon Rotary Club Sinner of the Year. Due to family commitments, James has been unable to attend club meetings in person, including the meeting of August 7, when the Sinner of the Year presentations were made. So, after last week's club meeting President Chuck Ertl, Sergeant at Arms chair Jim Hoenig and Sergeant at Arms member James Caskey went to James DeVary's office and made the presentation.

James had 218 fines, 11 more than runner-up Brad Raymond, and 56 more than he had the previous year when he finished fourth and was named Rookie-of-the Year.
