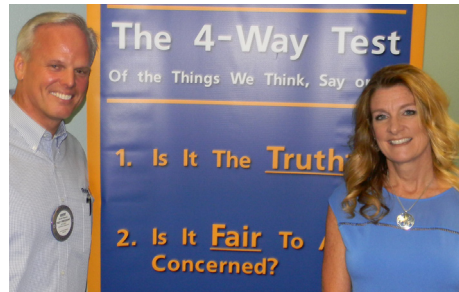

Program

Brent and Trudy Patmos (above) presented a program on their trip to Israel in April. Brent said it was "a trip of a lifetime." He said it was amazing that in only a few days they were able to zig-zag the width and breadth of Israel, which is about the size of New Jersey.

They talked about their visit to Jerusalem and how it is divided into four quarters: Jewish, Christian, Moslem and Armenian. Their Jewish tour guide was very knowledgeable not only of his faith but also that of the Christian faith. He said he would not pass to the other quarters in Jerusalem. Trudy commented that most places in Israel have walls built around them.

Other sites they visited in the Jerusalem area included the Western Wall (the most holy place for prayer in the Jewish faith), the Mount of Olives and the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus prayed.

They visited Bethlehem which is Palestinian controlled. Jews are not allowed. This is considered the "West Bank" area.

Trudy commented that the Holy site in Bethlehem was built up and flashy, but somewhat spiritually disappointing. Bethlehem and several other places like Golgotha are under the control of the Greek Orthodox community and they like the holy places to be very ornate.

Trudy said that at most holy places there were very long lines of pilgrims that came to visit. Some places were more than 2 ½ hours long.

A memorable place they visited was the Holocaust Museum, very humbling and moving.

At the Garden of the Righteous a tree is planted for each person who helped the Jews during that horrific time period. They had a photo of Schindler's tree.

They took an early morning hike up to Masada and had a beautiful photo of the sunrise from that vantage point. After they went to the Dead Sea. Brent, who usually is lead weight, found that he could float.

They visited the location of the Last Supper, and the seven stations on the Via Dolorosa. They visited the area of the River Jordan where it is thought that Christ was baptized, as well as a new larger area on the river bank, where there were visitors waiting to be baptized.

The took a "Jesus Boat" on their visit to the Sea of Galilee and Tiberius. While visiting Mount of Beatitudes, there was a national minute of silence/mourning.

They visited the Golan Heights on the Syrian Border, the Church of the Annunciation, Magdella, the home of Mary Magdelene, and the Church of Cana, where Jesus' first miracle took place.

They said that, if you could, you might be able to drive around Israel in six hours, but you cannot because of all the various walls. There are 5.7 million Jews who live in Israel.

Approximately 1.6 million tourists visit yearly. There are no Israeli passport stamps given out, only little visa cards, because the stamps are not always looked upon favorably by other countries.

The Israeli people are very serious about homeland security. It is mandatory for everyone, boys and girls, to do three years of military service after high school. Those in the military walk with their machine guns all the time.

Trudy said the food was amazing.
