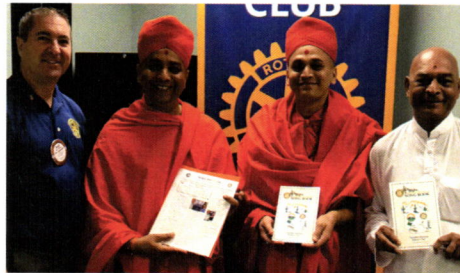

Program

Mahendra Patel along with Shastri Bhaktiprakasji and Shastri Vishvaprasaji presented a program on a semi-English medium school in Savda, Jalgoan, in the state of Maharashtra, India. The program was arranged by Roger Morsch.

Mahendra was educated in India as a priest before he came to the United States. He told us it is hard to establish an organization in India where most of the people are very poor.

But he was determined to establish a primary, secondary and higher education facility. He said the school was established in English because it is international and because of the many Indian dialects. He said education will provide opportunities, including money and peace.

They started with 100 students, and today more than 1,300 students receive a free education at this and other schools. There are 125 students who live at the school. "We all are one family," he said.

Originally, the school was only for boys, but Mahendra and others wanted more education for girls and have worked hard to accomplish that. He noted most women in India do not work. Today there are 130 girls attending the school who would not have an education otherwise.

Financing of the students is done through scholarships. It costs \$750 per year for a boy who lives at the school full time. It costs \$251 per year for a girl to attend the school but not live there. Soo-San Stevens-Clarke has offered to sponsor one girl for a year.

The school is located about 450 kilometers

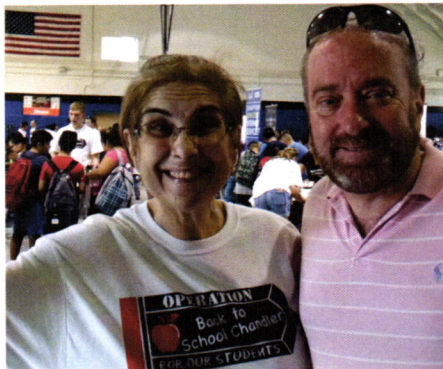
