Winslow was lowest among the 10 clubs that reported with 52.4 percent. The district average was 75.62 percent.

Pres. Theresa presented her items of emphasis, starting with the 2017-18 theme, Rotary: Making a Difference. She also plans to emphasize the Every Rotarian Every Year in terms of giving to The Rotary Foundation; the Hole-in-One Contest; and New Generations, more specifically better association with our Interact Club at Chandler High.

She presented a video from new Rotary International President Ian Riseley from Sandringham, Australia, who gave us his plans for this year. Through teamwork and cooperation we can do more together than we ever hope to do alone. The goal is to have stronger and more active clubs.

Pres. Theresa presented a chart showing demographics of Chandler Horizon Rotary during the past four years. The chart was broken down into age and gender classifications. We have had an overall decrease of 19 percent during that time, 11 percent male and 37 percent female.
